






MAP OF THE PHILIPPINES IDENTIFYING THE LOCATION OF REGION XII - SOCCSKSARGEN





PROFILE OF SULTAN KUDARAT PROVINCE

The Province of Sultan Kudarat is named after the famous sultan of Maguindanao, Sultan Mohammed Dipatuan Kudarat. It is composed of 11 municipalities and one city. It is situated between the provinces of Maguindanao and Cotabato on the north and South Cotabato and Sarangani on the south. As of 2015 Census of Population (POPCEN 2015), the province has a total population of 812,095 with an average household size of 4.4 members. Based on the 2010 Census of Population and Housing, the major dialects generally spoken are Hiligaynon/llonggo (38.0%), Maguindanaon (26.6%), Ilocano (12.8%), and Cebuano (7.6%).

The province has a total land area of 5,363.86 sq. km. The soil topography of the province ranges from plain and rolling to hilly and mountainous. The coastal towns of Lebak, Kalamansig and Palimbang in the western side are lined by mountain ranges that wall the central portion of the province from the sea. Its soils are favorable for the cultivation of all kinds of crops especially for rice and corn. Major crops are palay, corn, coffee, coconut, banana, african palm oil and sugar cane. Climate in the province is characterized by a short dry season of one to three months while the rainfall is evenly distributed throughout the year. The province is considered free from typhoons.

The province has some of the richest fishing grounds and vast brackish and fresh water areas in the region. The Celebes Sea at the western side of the province is the major source of fish including bangus and tuna fish. Others are Lake Buluan, existing marsh areas and numerous rivers and creeks.

The province is blessed with abundant water resources that could be utilized for drinking water, irrigation, hydropower and inland fish production and recreation purposes. There are 16 known big rivers including Ala River, Lulaman and Kabulnan rivers.

Part I THE PROVINCE



General Information



- Sultan Kudarat was created on November 22, 1973 pursuant to Presidential Decree No. 341.
- As of December 31, 2016, Sultan Kudarat is composed of 11 municipalities, one (1) city and 249 barangays. Tacurong City, its component city, has 20 barangays. Among the municipalities, Palimbang has the biggest number of barangays with 40, followed by Lebak, and Lambayong (Don Mariano Marcos) with 27 and 26 barangays, respectively.
- Based on the 2015 Census of Population, Sultan Kudarat with a total land area of 5,363.86 sq. km has a total population of 812,095. Lambayong, with 356 persons per square kilometer, is the most densely populated among the municipalities in the province. Columbio, at 36 persons for every square kilometer, is the least densely populated. Tacurong City has a population density of 641 persons per square kilometer.
- Sultan Kudarat's Human Development Index (HDI) in 2012 was estimated at 0.443, lower than its 2009 computed index of 0.448, the two component indices, life expectancy and income index also decreased except for education which increased in 2012. The progress was observed in education where an expansion of 0.007 point was noted. The education index rose from 0.781 in 2009 to 0.788 in 2012. The life expectancy index dropped by 0.005 point, income index dropped by 0.006 points during the three-year period.
- In 2014, live birth by place of occurrence in Sultan Kudarat Province decreased by 803 births from its 12,396 births in 2013 to 11,593 births in 2014. Out of 11,593 births in 2014, about 9,782 births were attended by health professionals followed by 1,775 births for traditional birth attendants, 33 births for others and 3 births not stated.
- In 2014, live birth by usual residence of mother in Sultan Kudarat Province was 11,432 births, about 560 births lower than its 11,992 births in 2013. About 5,751 births in 2014 were attended by midwives, followed by 3,573 births attended by physicians, and 1,791 births attended by hilot/unlicensed.
- In 2014, deaths by place of occurrence in Sultan Kudarat Province decreased by about 4.49 percent from its 2,830 deaths in 2013 to 2,703 deaths in 2014. About 2,703 deaths were attended and 1,918 deaths were categorized as not attended.

Fiscal Administration

- Per Department of Finance Order No. 23-2008 dated July 29, 2008, Sultan Kudarat Province remained to be a first class province since 2005.
- In 2016, Sultan Kudarat's total income amounted to P1,261.47 million, higher by 8.01 percent compared to its P1,160.38 million income in 2015.
- Sultan Kudarat collected a total tax revenue of P34.91 million in 2016 which was 9.52 percent higher than its P31.59 million tax revenues in 2015.
- Total expenditures of Sultan Kudarat in 2016 amounted to P888.83 million. The largest share of expenditures were spent on general public services which was about 39.58 percent of the total expenditures, followed by 23.81 percent on economic services. The least expenditure were on education, culture & sports/manpower development which was only recorded at 0.99 percent.

Income & Poverty Situation

The Countryside in Figures: Sultan Kudarat, 2017 Edition

- The poverty situation in Sultan Kudarat shows improvements as shown by the continuous decline in poverty incidence. In 2015 the poverty incidence among families was 39.2 percent, lower by 1.2 percentage points than its 40.4 percent recorded in 2012. Also the poverty incidence among population reduced from 48.5 percent in 2012 to 48.0 percent in 2015.
- In 2015, the number of poor families in Sultan Kudarat decreased by 2,631 families from 74,075 in 2012, however, its poor population increased from 357,960 in 2012 to 393,833 in 2015.
- In 2015, the amount needed by an individual in Sultan Kudarat to support his/her annual requirements of food and non-food basic needs as measured by the annual per capita poverty threshold was estimated at P20,620, 17.18% higher than its P17,597 reported in 2012. This means that the daily cost of living in Sultan Kudarat per person was about P56.49 in 2015. A family of five needed P282 daily or P8,586.48 monthly to support its food and non-food basic needs.
- In 2015, a person residing in Sultan Kudarat needed P14,403 yearly to sustain his/her required daily food needs, 17.12 percent higher than its P12,298 in 2012. An individual needed to budget P39 for his daily food requirement while a family of five must have P195 daily or P 6,000 monthly to meet its food requirements.

Agriculture



- Sultan Kudarat produced 417,974 metric tons of palay in 2016. However palay production in 2016 was about 3.43 percent lower than its previous year's production of 432,842 metric tons.
- Sultan Kudarat produced 237,704 metric tons of corn in 2016 which was, 2.44 percent lower than its 243,654 metric tons in 2015.
- Sultan Kudarat's coconut yield in 2016 reached 235,726 metric tons, about 43,085 metric tons lower than its previous year's production of 278,811 metric tons.
- Sultan Kudarat's banana production increased by 44.70 percent in 2016 from 49,404 metric tons in 2015 to 89,337 metric tons in 2016.
- In 2016, Sultan Kudarat was able to produce 89,015 metric tons of palm oil (fresh fruit bunch), about 0.61 percent lower than its 89,566 metric tons in 2015. However, Sultan Kudarat remained to be the main producer of palm oil in the region.
- In 2016, Sultan Kudarat produced 21,119 metric tons of coffee (dried berries), 2.21 percent lower than its 21,597 metric tons in 2015. Despite the decrease in production, Sultan Kudarat remained as the top coffee producer not only in SOCCSKSARGEN Region but among all provinces nationwide earning the moniker "Coffee Capital of the Philippines." In 2016, the province's coffee production accounted for 84.14 percent of the region's total production for the year. Nationwide, it accounted for 30.7 percent of the total production during the year.
- In 2016, Sultan Kudarat sugarcane's production decreased by 35.34 percent from 128,356 metric tons produced in 2015 to 82,991 metric tons in 2016. Despite of the decrease in 2016, the province's sugarcane production got the 17th rank nationwide on the said year.
- In 2016, chicken heads inventoried in Sultan Kudarat reached 705,341 about 7.12 percent higher than its 655,152 heads in 2015. Almost all (99.7%) of the chickens in the province were raised in backyard farms.
- Sultan Kudarat is the biggest raiser of ducks in SOCCSKSARGEN in 2016. During the year, ducks raised in the province accounted for 45.4 percent of the total ducks inventoried in the region. From 421,679 heads in 2015, ducks inventoried in the province increased to 565,895 heads in 2016.

- Inventory of carabaos in Sultan Kudarat reached to 70,886 heads in 2016 from its 68,803 heads in 2015.
- In 2016, inventory of cattle in Sultan Kudarat reached to 38,142 heads, higher by about 3.93 percent than its 36,642 heads in 2015.
- Sultan Kudarat is the second biggest raiser of goats in the region, accounting for 24.9 percent of the goats raised in the region in 2016. The inventory of goats in the province was recorded at 57,158 heads in 2016 from its 36,642 heads reported in 2015.
- In 2016, inventory of hogs in Sultan Kudarat reached to 79,686 heads, higher by about 3.87 percent than its 76,602 heads in 2015.
- Fish caught in Sultan Kudarat in 2016 reached 17,778 metric tons, lesser than the 22,425 metric tons caught in 2015. About 10,998 metric tons of it came from municipal fisheries, followed by 3,951 metric tons from commercial fisheries and 2,829 metric tons from aquaculture.

Education

- In SY 2016-2017 public elementary schools in Sultan Kudarat was numbered at 352. Of the 352 public elementary schools in the province, 307 were considered complete elementary schools, 25 were classified complete central schools, 9 were complete primary schools, 6 were incomplete primary schools, and 5 incomplete elementary schools.
- During the same school year, Sultan Kudarat had a total of 73 public secondary schools, 36 of which were classified as schools with no annexes, 18 as mother schools, and 19 were considered annex schools. An annex school has its own campus but administratively under a school called main school.
- Public elementary enrolment for SY 2016-2017 in Sultan Kudarat reached 108,439 lower by 1,270 from the previous school year's enrolment.
- In SY 2016-2017, Sultan Kudarat recorded 45,929 enrollees in public secondary schools, an addition of 7,421 students or 16.16 percent of SY 2016-2017 enrollees compared to the previous school year.
- At the elementary level, Sultan Kudarat had teacher-pupil ratio (TPR) of about 30 pupils per teacher during SY 2014-2015; down by about five pupil when compared to the previous school year.
- At the secondary level, Sultan Kudarat had an estimated teacher-student ratio (TSR) of one teacher for every 28 students in SY 2014-2015, lower than its 37 students per one teacher in SY 2013-2014.
- In SY 2015-2016, Sultan Kudarat had a total of 900 dropouts out of 99,853 enrollees in combined public and private elementary schools. Grade 1 had the highest dropouts with 231 dropouts out of 17,728 enrollees, while Grade 6 had the lowest dropouts of 101 pupils.
- At the secondary level, Sultan Kudarat had 987 dropouts out of 41,495 enrollees SY 2015-2016. The highest dropouts was noticed in first year with 353 dropouts, while fourth year has the lowest dropouts of 138 dropouts.

- In 2016, influenza was the leading cause of morbidity in Sultan Kudarat. The disease afflicted 21,538 persons during the year and on the average about 17,725 persons per year from the period 2012-2016. Aside from influenza, the other leading causes of morbidity in the province in 2016 were Bronchitis/Bronchiolitis (17,879 cases), Hypertensive Vascular Diseases (11,118 cases), Diarrhea (10,474 cases) and Pneumonia (10,433 cases).
- The top cause of mortality in Sultan Kudarat in 2016 was hypertensive vascular disease which caused the loss of 439 lives or about 51 deaths for every 100 thousand population in the province. The other leading causes of mortality in the province in 2016 were pneumonia which claimed 328 lives; renal/kidney diseases, 244 lives; Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease, 182 lives; all forms of cancer, 171 deaths; myocardial infarction which resulted to 168 deaths, accidents and violence, 147 deaths, and congestive heart failure, 115 deaths.
- From 2012-2016, pneumonia, prematurity and septicemia were the top three leading causes of infant deaths in Sultan Kudarat. In 2016, about 21 infants lost their lives due to pneumonia; 19 died of prematurity; and 17 deaths due to septicemia.
- Among mothers in Sultan Kudarat, post-partum hemorrhage and hypertension in pregnancy were the leading causes of maternal deaths in 2016, each with three (3) cases. Other causes were retained placenta, uterine atony, placenta with coagulation and aminiotic fluid embolism.
- In 2016, 128,239 households in Sultan Kudarat had access to sanitary toilets or about 70.34 percent of the total households in the province. Access of households to safe water supply increased to 147,315 households in 2016 from 144,397 households in 2015.
- Contraceptive prevalence rate (CPR) in Sultan Kudarat was on the uptrend from 2011 to 2015. CPR in 2015 was reported at 69.1 percent, up from 60.0 percent and 56.8 percent in 2013 and 2014, respectively.
- In terms of solid waste disposal, only 105,410 households or about 62.4 percent of the total households in Sultan Kudarat had satisfactory solid waste disposal systems. Further, only about 63.82 percent of the households had basic sanitation facilities.
- In 2016, the number of medical personnel in Sultan Kudarat was 158 Midwives, followed by 88 Nurses, 40 Doctors and 13 Dentist.
- In 2016, Sultan Kudarat had a total of 57 Hospitals, 22 are private hospitals and 5 are government hospitals.

- In 2016, reported crimes in Sultan Kudarat decreased to 2,941 cases, lower than the reported 4,724 crimes in 2015. About 40.5 percent of the cases reported in the province were classified as index crimes and the remaining 59.5 percent were non-index crimes.
- About 49.47 percent of the total crimes reported in Sultan Kudarat in 2016 were considered solved. Solved cases include those filed with the prosecutor's office/proper court with at least one of the suspects arrested.
- In terms of policeman to population ratio (PPR), Sultan Kudarat had one policeman for every 815 persons in 2016.
- In 2016, Sultan Kudarat had 143 firemen serving the entire province. This translated to about one fireman for every 5,494 persons as opposed to the standard ratio of one fire-fighter for every 2,000 individuals.
- A total of 80 fire incidents occurred in the province in 2016. The fires gutted properties amounting to more than P 61.5 million.

General Information

- Per Department of Finance Order No. 23-2008 dated July 29, 2008, Sultan Kudarat has six (6) first class municipalities, three (3) second class municipalities and two (2) third class municipalities. Its component and lone city, Tacurong, has been categorized as a fourth class city.
- Based on the 2015 Census on Population (POPCEN), the municipality of Isulan, being the province's capital, had the highest population at 90,682 while Columbio had the lowest population at 33,258. However, Columbio had the highest growth rate from 2010-2015 at 3.73 percent annually overtaking Sen. Ninoy Aquino from the top post in 2007-2010.
- Among the 249 barangays, Brgy, Poblacion in Tacurong City had the highest population at 16,199 followed by Kalawag II (Poblacion) in Isulan at 15,330. Brgy. Makat (Sumali Pas) in Columbio had the lowest number of people at 738.
- Based on the POPCEN 2015, Lambayong was the most densely populated municipality in Sultan Kudarat with about 356 persons residing per square kilometer of land. Columbio, on the otherhand, was the least densely populated municipality in the province with about 36 persons for every square kilometer.
- In 2015, the average household size in Sultan Kudarat was 4.4 members. Among the municipalities in the province, Lutayan had the biggest household size at 4.8 persons while the Sen. Ninoy Aquino got the lowest household size at 4.0.
- In 2014, the highest live births by place of occurrence in Sultan Kudarat was recorded in the municipality of Isulan with a total of 3,020 live births followed by Lebak with 1,195 live births and Lambayong 1,033 live births. The lowest live birth by place of occurrence was recorded in the municipality Palimbang with a total of 240 live births.
- In 2014, live births by usual residence of mother in Sultan Kudarat was recorded highest in the municipality of Isulan with 1,392 live births, followed by Lambayong with 1,392 live births, Lebak 1,267 live births, Bagumbayan 1,173 live births and Esperanza with 1,008 live births. The municipality of Palimbang recorded the lowest live births of 336 in 2014.
- In 2014, death by place of occurrence in Sultan Kudarat was recorded highest in municipality of Isulan with 588 deaths, followed by Esperanza 310 recorded deaths, Lebak, 273 deaths and Lambayong, 259 deaths. The municipality of Columbio recorded the lowest number of deaths with 47 deaths.
- In 2014, the highest recorded deaths by usual place of residence in Sultan Kudarat was observed in the municipality of Isulan with 505 deaths, followed by Esperanza with 329 deaths and Lambayong 303 deaths. The lowest number was recorded in Palimbang with 33 deaths.

- From 2015-2016, the municipality of Isulan consistently edged the other 10 municipalities in Sultan Kudarat in terms of total income. Isulan's total income in 2016 reached ₽ 268.1 million or about ₽ 33.2 million more than the total income realized in 2015. Pres. Quirino, on the other hand, had the lowest income among the municipalities in the province at ₽ 107.2 million.
- Isulan, which is more urbanized compared to the other municipalities in the province, was able to collect ₽ 26.1 million worth of tax revenues in 2016 or about 1.7 percent more than the previous year. Lutayan generated the lowest tax revenues at ₽ 1.4 million.
- Among the municipalities, Isulan posted the highest expenditures in 2016 at ₽ 210.6 million, about ₽ 33.6 million higher than the amount it expended in 2015.
- The municipality of Isulan spent the highest for health, nutrition and population control at ₽ 20.4 million in 2016, followed by Lambayong with ₽ 17.8 million for health, nutrition and population control. Isulan's expenditures on health, nutrition and population control represented 9.7 percent of its total expenditures.
- In 2016, Lutayan spent the highest for social sevices and welfare at ₽ 43.5 million which represented about 34.8 percent of its total expenditures during the year. Columbio, on the other hand, spent the highest on economic services at ₽ 76.2 million or about 44.9 percent of its total expendetures.
- Of the 11 municipalities in Sultan Kudarat, not one municipality had incurred a deficit in 2016. Lebak was able to save ₽ 61.8 million in 2016 from a ₽ 49.9 million savings the previous year. Pres. Quirino posted the lowest savings at ₽ 4.6 million in 2016.

Education



- As of SY 2016-2017, there were 352 public elementary schools in Sultan Kudarat, 307 were classified as complete elementary schools while the rest were either incomplete primary schools (6), complete primary schools (9), incomplete elementary schools (5) or complete elementary central schools (25). The municipalities with most number of elementary schools were Bagumbayan with 41; Sen. Ninoy Aquino, 38; and Lebak, 38. Tacurong City had 24 public elementary schools, 20 classified as complete elementary schools while the other 4 was complete elementary central schools.
- As of SY 2016-2017 there were 73 nationally-funded public secondary schools in Sultan Kudarat, 36 of which were main/independent schools while 19 were categorized as annex secondary schools. Esperanza and Lebak each had five (5) of the main/independent schools.
- In SY 2014-2015, Sultan Kudarat had a total public elementary enrolment of 125,409, about 10.53 percent higher than the previous school year. Lebak, with 16,735 enrollees on the said school year, accounted for the biggest public elementary enrolment at 13.34 percent. Aside from Lebak, the other two municipalities with the highest enrolment were Isulan (14,269) and Palimbang (11,210). Columbio had the lowest number of enrollees with 6,060 pupils while its component city Tacurong had 14,209 enrollees during the said school year.
- From SY 2013-2014 to SY 2014-2015, the enrolment in secondary schools increased by about 1,589 pupils from 35,676 enrollees of SY 2013-2014 to 37,265 enrolles of SY 2014-2015. The municipalities with the most number of public secondary enrollees were Isulan (5,308), Lebak (4,063), Esperanza (4,036), Bagumbayan (3,490), and Lambayong (3,454).
- Teacher-pupil ratio (TPR) in Sultan Kudarat in SY 2014-2015 was highest in Kalamansig at about one teacher per 44 pupils followed by Lebak with a TPR of 1:42. The municipality of President Quirino had the least TPR of about 1:28 during school year same from its previous year SY 2013-2014. The TPR of the province was 1:35.
- The municipality with the highest teacher-student ratio (TSR) for public secondary schools in all municipalities in Sultan Kudarat in SY 2014-2015 was Kalamansig with one teacher for every 34 students. Kalamansig was followed by Isulan with a TSR of 1:31 during the said school year. Sen. Ninoy Aquino was the municipality with the least TSR at 1:20. Five (5) municipalities had TSR higher than the Provincial average of 1:28. Tacurong City had a TSR of 1:30.

- During the SY 2016-2017, pupil per class ratio (PCR) in Sultan Kudarat averaged at 35, lower than its previous school year's PCR. A class in Kalamansig in SY 2016-2017 had 42 pupils, the highest among the municipalities in Sultan Kudarat as opposed to Sen. Ninoy Aquino's 27 pupils per class, the lowest in the province. Tacurong City had PCR of 33 pupils, less forty six (46) pupils compared to SY 2015-2016.
- At the secondary level, students in a class averaged at about 48 during SY 2016-2017, about ten (10) students less from a year ago. Among municipalities, Isulan had the highest number of students per class at 52 while the lowest was noted in Kalamansig at 44. Tacurong City had a student per class ratio of about 49 during the SY 2016-2017 same from the previous school year's SCR.

Health and Nutrition

- Among the 11 municipalities in Sultan Kudarat, Lambayong at 13.05 deaths had the highest incidence of reported infant deaths per 1,000 livebirths in 2016; the lowest was in Palimbang which recorded less than 1 infant death for every 1,000 livebirths on the said year.
- At 14.01 deaths, Senator Ninoy Aquino had recorded the highest incidence of deaths among children 5 years old and below per 1,000 children on the said age range in 2016. Palimbang, on the other hand, had 0.97 deaths per 1,000 children aged 5 years old and below, the lowest in 2016 among the 11 municipalities in Sultan Kudarat.
- Malnutrition prevalence rate (MPR) among children 6 years old and below in 2016 was highest in Columbio at 14.18 percent. Among the 11 municipalities, Esperanza, posted the lowest malnutrition prevalence rate with 4.11 percent.
- In terms of having access to safe water supply in 2016, the municipality of Kalamansig had 99.86 percent of its household access to safe water supply. Nearly half of the households in Palimbang, on the other hand, had no access to safe water supply.

Poverty Situation

- In 2012, six (6) of the 11 municipalities in Sultan Kudarat had more than half of their population considered poor. Palimbang had the most number of poor as about 58 for every 100 of its constituents were considered poor. Aside from Palimbang, in the top five in terms of poverty incidence in Sultan Kudarat were Columbio (54.7), Sen. Ninoy Aquino (54.6), Lebak (51.3) and Kalamansig (51.0).
- Except for Lutayan and Palimbang, poverty incidence in the municipalities worsened from 2009 to 2012. Lambayong registered the highest increase with 9.5 percentage points followed by Sen. Ninoy Aquino 7.0 percentage points increase and Esperanza with 5.4 percentage points increase. On the other hand, Lutayan was able to cut the incidence of poverty by 9.0 percentage points from 51.1 in 2009 to 42.1 in 2012, Palimbang also was able to cut the incidence from 63.7 in 2009 to 57.6 in 2012.
- The least poor municipalities in Sultan Kudarat in 2012 were Isulan (with 29.9 poverty incidence) followed by President Quirino (32.7 %).
- In terms of degree of poorness or severity of poverty, this was remarkably noted in the municipalities of Sen. Ninoy Aquino at 9.5 percent followed by Palimbang (8.8%), Bagumbayan (7.9%), Columbio (7.3%) and Kalamansig (7.0%)

Housing



- In 2010, about 42.0 percent of the households in Sultan Kudarat had occupied housing units with outer walls made of bamboo/sawali/cogon/nipa. Columbio had the highest percentage of occupied housing units whose outer walls were made of bamboo/sawali/cogon/nipa at 61.0 percent and about 574 houses in the province had outer walls made of makeshift/salvaged/improvised materials.
- In 2010, the number of occupied housing units with roofs made of galvanized iron/aluminum constituted 56.7 percent of the households in Sultan Kudarat. This group of housing units increased by 16.91 percent from three years ago from 78,704 housing units in year 2007 to 94,722 housing units in year 2010. At 87.8 percent, Tacurong City had the highest percentage of households whose occupied housing units used galvanized iron/aluminum. Isulan, on the otherhand, had 80.5 percent of its housing units whose roofs were made of galvanized iron/aluminum, the highest among the municipalities.
- Among the Municipalities in Sultan Kudarat, Palimbang had the highest percentage of housing units with roofs made of cogon/nipa/anahaw with 68.6, followed by Columbio with 64.8 percent. A total of 273 houses had roof made of makeshift/salvaged/improvised materials.
- In 2010, about 114,621 of the 168,909 households in Sultan Kudarat had houses that were built on lots owned/being amortized. These group of households increased by 16.3 percent from 2007 figures. About 11.8 percent of the households whose residential lots were owned or being amortized were located in Lebak; about 10.5 percent were in Isulan, about 10.0 percent in Tacurong City, and another 10.0 percent in Bagumbayan.
- The total occupied housing units in Sultan Kudarat in 2010 reached 168,909 or an increase of 15.1 percent from the number of 143,437 housing units recorded in 2007.

Public Order and Safety



- Lutayan remained the most peaceful municipality in Sultan Kudarat for period 2014-2016. The municipality recorded a crime incidence of 0.44 per 10,000 population in 2016. This, however, was higher than the 0.30 crime incidence it posted in 2014. The other municipalities with low crime rates in 2016 were Palimbang (1.19), Sen. Ninoy Aquino (1.37) and Lambayong (1.40). Isulan, on the other hand, posted the highest crime incidence with 5.88 crimes for every 10,000 people.
- In 2016, Lutayan recorded the lowest index crime rate at 0.11 crimes per 10,000 per person while Isulan posted the highest at 2.62 index crimes for every 10, 000 population. Index crimes include actual crimes of murder, homicide, physical injury (serious and less serious), robbery, theft, and rape.
- For non-index crimes, the lowest crime rate in 2016 was noted in Lutayan at 0.33 crimes per 10,000 population while Isulan had the highest crime rate at 3.26 crimes per 10,000 persons. Non-index crimes include negligent manslaughter, non-aggravated assault, forgery & counterfeiting, fraud, embezzlement, stolen property, vandalism, weapons, prostitution & common law vice, sex offenses, narcotic laws, gambling, offenses against family & children, driving under the influence of liquor, disorderly conduct, and all other crimes not listed under index crimes.
- The incidence of crimes against person per 10,000 population was highest in Lebak in 2016. About 0.55 crimes for every 10,000 people were committed in the said municipality in 2016. On the other hand, the municipality of Lutayan recoded the lowest (0.4) crimes against person during the same year. Crimes against person include murder, homicide, physical injuries, rape, etc.
- The incidence of crimes against property per 10,000 was highest in Isulan in 2016. About 2.20 of such crimes per 10,000 people were reportedly committed in 2016. The lowest incidence was noted in Lambayong at 0.03 crimes for every 10,000 people during the same year. Crimes against property include robbery, theft, swindling, arson, etc.
- The policeman to population ratio was highest in the municipality of Palimbang at 2,523 person per police officer white the ratio was lowest in Pres. Quirino at 635 person per police officer.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Household – a social unit consisting of a person living alone or a group of persons who sleep in the same housing unit and have a common arrangement in the preparation and consumption of food.

Household Population – the population enumerated in private households during a census.

Household Size – number of usual members in a private household.

Human Development Index – a measure of how well a country has performed, not only in terms of real income growth, but also in terms of social indicators of people's ability to lead a long and healthy life, to acquire knowledge and skills, and to have access to the resources needed to afford a decent standard of living.

Medium Assumption – moderate fertility decline and mortality decline.

Population – total number of individuals in a territory at a specified time. It covers both nationals and aliens, native and foreign-born persons, internees, refugees and any other group physically present within the borders of a country at a specified time. In assembling national demographic statistics for publication, the basic aim has been to obtain data for the physically present (or de facto) population rather than for the legally established resident (or de jure) inhabitants.

Population Census – the total process of collecting, compiling, evaluating, analyzing and publishing demographic, economic and social data pertaining to all persons in the country or in a well-limited territory.

Population Density – refers to the number of persons per unit of land area (usually in square kilometers). This measure is more meaningful if given as population per unit of arable land.

Population Growth Rate – indicates how fast a population increases or decreases as a result of the interplay of births, deaths, and migration during a given period of time. Where the population is closed, meaning no migration, the population growth rate is the same as the rate of natural increase, i.e., the difference between the number of births and the number of deaths during a specified period of time. The three methods for computing the rate of growth based on the assumption with respect to the change are: arithmetic change, geometric change and exponential change.

Population Projection – computation of future changes in population numbers, given certain assumptions about future trends in the rates of fertility, mortality and migration. Demographers often publish high, medium, and low projections of the same population based on different assumptions of how these rates will change in the future.



INCOME AND POVERTY SITUATION

Consumer Price Index (CPI) – measure of the average changes in the prices of a fixed basket of goods and services usually purchased by households for their consumption.

Family – a group of persons usually living together and composed of the head and other persons related to the head by blood, marriage or adoption. It includes both the nuclear and extended family.

Family expenditures – refer to the expenses or disbursements mad by the family purely for personal consumption during the calendar year. They exclude all expenses in relation to farm or business operation, investment ventures, purchase of real property and other disbursements which do not involve personal consumption.

Family size - number of members present in the family.

Magnitude of the Poor – the number of families or the population whose annual per capita income falls below the subsistence/poverty threshold.

Per Capita Income – is obtained by dividing the total family income by the number family members.

Poverty Incidence – proportion of families/population whose annual per capita income falls below the annual per capita poverty threshold to the total number of families/population.

Poverty Threshold – annual per capita income required or the amount to be spent to satisfy nutritional requirements (2,000 Kcal) and other basic needs.

Poverty Gap – the total income/expenditure shortfall (expressed in proportion to the poverty threshold) of families/individuals with income/expenditure below the poverty threshold, divided by the total number of families/individuals.

Subsistence Incidence – proportion of families/population whose annual per capita income falls below the annual per capita food/subsistence threshold to the total number of families/population.

Subsistence and Food Threshold – annual per capita income required or the amount to be spent to satisfy nutritional requirements (2,000 Kcal).

Total Family Income – includes primary income and receipts from other sources received by all family members during the calendar year as participants in any economic activity or as recipients of transfers, pensions, grants, etc.

Agricultural Production – the growing field crops, fruits, nuts, seeds, tree nurseries (except those of forest trees), bulb vegetables and flowers, both in the open and under glass; and the production of coffee, tea, cocoa, rubber; and the production of livestock and livestock products, honey rabbits, fur-bearing animals, silkworm, cocoons, etc. Forestry and fishery production carried on as an ancillary activity on an agricultural holding is also considered as agricultural production.

Aquaculture – sector of fisheries that includes the rearing or raising under controlled conditions of aquatic products such as fish, oysters, mussels, sea weeds and other aquatic resources in sea, lakes and rivers. Examples are fishponds, fish pens and fish cages.

Commercial Fishing – sector of fisheries that includes the catching of fish in marine waters with the use of fishing boat of more than three (3) gross tons and beyond the seven (7) kilometers shoreline limit.

Municipal Fishing – sector of fisheries that includes the catching of fish in marine and inland waters with the use of fishing boat of three (3) gross tons or less, or using gear not requiring the use of boats.

<u>HEALTH</u>

Infant Mortality Rate - the annual number of deaths of infants under one year of age per 1,000 live births.

Maternal Death – the death of woman while pregnant or within 42 days of termination of pregnancy, irrespective of the duration and the site of the pregnancy or its management, but not from accidental or incidental causes.

Maternal Mortality Rate - the annual number of deaths of women from pregnancy-related causes per 100,000 live births.

Morbidity – any departure, subjective or objective, from a stage of physiological well-being.

Mortality Rate – generally expresses the chance that death will occur during a particular period to a person in particular population group alive at the beginning of the period. As such, those rates are true probabilities and describe precisely the risk of dying for any actual cohort.

EDUCATION

Cohort Survival Rate – the percentage of enrollees at the beginning grade or year in a given school year who reached the final grade or year of the elementary/secondary level.

Completion Rate – the percentage of first grade/year entrants in a level of education who complete/finish the level in accordance with the required number of years of study.

Dropout Rate – the percentage of pupils/students who leave school during the year for any reason as well as those who complete the previous grade/year level but fail to enroll in the next grade/year level the following school year to the total number of pupils/students enrolled during the previous school year.

Enrolment - the total number of students who have registered as of August 31 in a given school year.

Net Enrolment Ratio – the ratio of the enrolment for the age group corresponding to the official school age in the elementary/secondary level to the population of the same age group in a given year. Also known as <u>Participation Rate</u>.

Transition Rate - the percentage of enrollees/graduates in a level of education in a given school year who moved on to the next higher level the following year.

Repetition rate - this is an EFA indicator which determines the magnitude of pupils/students who repeat a grade/year level.

Electricity Supply

Grid Supply - point at which energy is taken from the National Grid transmission system into a local distribution system.

Generator - machine that convert's mechanical energy into electricity.

Solar Power - sun's energy either directly as thermal energy (heat) or through the use of photovoltaic cells in solar panels and transparent photovoltaic glass to generate electricity.

Water supply

- Local Pipe pipe or tube designed to transport water to consumers, pipes include large diameter main pipes, which supply entire towns, smaller branch lines that supply a street or group of buildings, or small diameter pipes located within individual buildings.
- Water Well/Deep Well an excavation or structure created in the ground by digging, driving, boring, or drilling to access groundwater in underground aquifers.

Rainwater Catchment - the process of collecting direct rainwater that falls on the roof of a building into container or tanks.

Natural Source – source of water that basically you can see and access easily, these natural source are often accessed through rivers, falls, spring, etc.

Crime Incidence – the number of crimes reported as to index or non-index crimes within a given period.

Crime Rate – number of crimes committed per 10,000 population.

Index Crimes – crimes which are sufficiently significant and which occur with sufficient regularity to be meaningful. Crimes which include the following: murder, physical injury, robbery, theft and rape.

Non – Index Crimes – all types of crimes not considered as index crimes.

PUBLIC FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Annual Income – refers to revenues and receipts realized by provinces, cities and municipalities from the regular sources of Local General fund inclusive of IRA and other shares provided for in Section 284, section 290 and Section 291 of the Local Government Code of 1991 or RA No. 7160, exclusive, however, of non-recurring receipts such as national aids, grants, financial assistance, loan proceeds, sales of assets, and other. As provided for under Section 1 and Section 2 of Executive Order No. 249, dated July 25, 1987, provinces, cities and municipalities, except Manila and Quezon City which shall remain special class cities, shall be divided into six (6) main classes according to the average annual income realized during the last four calendar years immediately preceding the year of re-classification. Based on the Financial Statement of the LGUs for CY 2004-2007 of the Commission on Audit, the income brackets of provinces, cities and municipalities which shall be used in their re-classification are ranged, as follows:

Grants – all non-repayable transfers received from other levels of government or from private individuals, or institutions including reparations and gifts given for particular projects or programs, or for general budget support.

Non-Tax Revenue – revenue collected from sources other than compulsory tax levies. Includes those collected in exchange for direct services rendered by government agencies to the public, or those arising from the government's regulatory and investment activities.

Personal Services – provisions for the payment of salaries, wages and other compensation (e.g., merit, salary increase, cost of living allowances, honoraria and commutable allowances) of permanent, temporary, contractual and casual employees of the government.

Revenue – a cash inflow which does not increase the liability of the government.

Taxes on Income and Profit – taxes imposed on all taxable income earned or received by a taxpayer whether an individual, partnership, or corporation, during a particular period of time, usually lasting one year.

Taxes on Property – taxes imposed on the ownership of wealth or immovable properties and on the transfer of real or personal properties, both tangible and intangible.
