






MAP OF THE PHILIPPINES IDENTIFYING THE LOCATION OF REGION XII - SOCCSKSARGEN






MAP OF THE SOCCSKSARGEN REGION IDENTIFYING THE LOCATION OF SULTAN KUDARAT PROVINCE

PROFILE OF SULTAN KUDARAT PROVINCE

The Province of Sultan Kudarat is named after the famous sultan of Maguindanao, Sultan Mohammed Dipatuan Kudarat. It is composed of 11 municipalities and one city. It is situated between the provinces of Maguindanao and Cotabato on the north and South Cotabato and Sarangani on the south. In 2020 Census of Population and Housing (2020 CPH), the province has a total population of 854,052. Based on 2015 Census of Population (POPCEN 2015), the province has a total population of 812,095 with an average household size of 4.4 members. On the 2010 Census of Population and Housing, the major dialects generally spoken are Hiligaynon/Ilonggo (38.0%), Maguindanaon (26.6%), Ilocano (12.8%), and Cebuano (7.6%).

The province has a total land area of 5,363.86 sq. km. The soil topography of the province ranges from plain and rolling to hilly and mountainous. The coastal towns of Lebak, Kalamansig and Palimbang in the western side are lined by mountain ranges that wall the central portion of the province from the sea. Its soils are favorable for the cultivation of all kinds of crops especially for rice and corn. Major crops are palay, corn, coffee, coconut, banana, african palm oil and sugar cane. Climate in the province is characterized by a short dry season of one to three months while the rainfall is evenly distributed throughout the year. The province is considered free from typhoons.

The province has some of the richest fishing grounds and vast brackish and fresh water areas in the region. The Celebes Sea at the western side of the province is the major source of fish including bangus and tuna fish. Others are Lake Buluan, existing marsh areas and numerous rivers and creeks.

The province is blessed with abundant water resources that could be utilized for drinking water, irrigation, hydropower and inland fish production and recreation purposes. There are 16 known big rivers including Ala River, Lulaman and Kabulnan rivers.

- Sultan Kudarat was created on November 22, 1973 pursuant to Presidential Decree No. 341.
- As of December 31, 2016, Sultan Kudarat is composed of 11 municipalities, one (1) city and 249 barangays. Tacurong City, its component city, has 20 barangays. Among the municipalities, Palimbang has the biggest number of barangays with 40, followed by Lebak, and Lambayong (Don Mariano Marcos) with 27 and 26 barangays, respectively.
- Based on the 2020 Census of Population, Sultan Kudarat with a total land area of 5,363.86 sq. km has a total population of 854,052. Lambayong, with 369 persons per square kilometer, is the most densely populated among the municipalities in the province. Columbio, at 36 persons for every square kilometer, is the least densely populated. Tacurong City has a population density of 713 persons per square kilometer.
- In 2019, registered live births by place of occurrence in Sultan Kudarat Province increased by 339 births from its 11,797 births in 2018 to 12,136 births in 2019. Out of 12,136 births in 2019, about 10,979 births were attended by health professionals, followed by 1,284 births attended by traditional birth attendants and 19 births for others.
- In 2019, registered live births by usual residence of mother in Sultan Kudarat Province was 12,282 births, an increased by 456 births from its 11,826 births in 2018. About 10,979 births in 2019 were attended by health professionals, followed by 1,284 births attended by traditional birth attendants and 19 births for others.
- In 2018, registered deaths by place of occurrence in Sultan Kudarat Province increased by about 2.04 percent from its 3,036 deaths in 2017 to 3,098 deaths in 2018. About 1,439 deaths were attended and 1,659 deaths recorded not attended.

- Per Department of Finance Order No. 23-2008 dated July 29, 2008, Sultan Kudarat Province remained to be a first class province since 2005.
- Based on 2019 Sultan Kudarat's total income amounted to P1,690.83 million, higher by 10.03 percent compared to its P1,536.64 million in 2018. Based on 2018
- Based on 2019 Sultan Kudarat collected a total tax revenue of P54.96 million, 14.35 higher than its P48.07 million total tax revenues in 2018.
- Total expenditures of Sultan Kudarat in 2019 amounted to P1,445.66 million. The largest share of expenditures were spent on general public services which was about 35.76 percent of the total expenditures, followed by 23.81 percent on economic services. The least expenditure were on education, culture and sports/manpower development which was only recorded at 0.94 percent.

Income & Poverty Situation

The Countryside in Figures: Sultan Kudarat, 2021 Edition

- The poverty situation in Sultan Kudarat shows improvements as shown by the continuous decline in poverty incidence. In 2018 the poverty incidence among families was 24.3 percent, lower by 16.9 percentage points than its 41.2 percent recorded in 2015. Also the poverty incidence among population reduced from 49.8 percent in 2015 to 31.5 percent in 2018.
- In 2018, the number of poor families in Sultan Kudarat decreased to 46.5 families from 74.9 in 2015 while its poor population also decrease from 403.0 in 2015 to 264.1 in 2018.
- In 2018, the amount needed by an individual in Sultan Kudarat to support his/her annual requirements of food and non-food basic needs as measured by the annual per capita poverty threshold was estimated at P23,775, 12.08% higher than its P21,212 reported in 2015. This means that the daily cost of living in Sultan Kudarat per person was about P65.14 in 2018. A family of five needed P326 daily or P9,907.79 monthly to support their food and non-food basic needs.
- In 2018, a person residing in Sultan Kudarat needed P16,576 yearly to sustain his/her required daily food needs, 11.88 percent higher than its P14,816 in 2015. An individual needed to budget P45 for his daily food requirement while a family of five must have P 225 daily or P 6,845 monthly to meet its food requirements.

Agriculture

- Sultan Kudarat produced 396,899.98 metric tons of palay in 2020, higher by 5.35 percent compared to its 376,749.31 metric tons in 2019.
- Sultan Kudarat produced 253,184.00 metric tons of corn in 2020. Corn production in 2020 was slightly higher about 3.13 percent than its previous year's production of 245,504.29 metric tons.
- Sultan Kudarat's coconut production in 2020 recorded 229,432 metric tons, (3.54) percent lower than its previous year's production of 237,858 metric tons.
- Sultan Kudarat's banana production decreased by 12,789 metric tons in 2020 from 186,289 metric tons in 2019.
- In 2020, Sultan Kudarat produced 99,675 metric tons of palm oil (fresh fruit bunch), 14.50 percent lower than its 116,579 metric tons in 2019.
- In 2020, Sultan Kudarat produced 18,339 metric tons of coffee (dried berries), 8.36 percent higher than its 16,925 metric tons in 2019. Sultan Kudarat remains as the top coffee producer not only in SOCCSKSARGEN but among all provinces nationwide earning the moniker "Coffee Capital of the Philippines". In 2020, the province's coffee production accounted for 84.95 percent of the region's total production for the year. Nationwide, it accounted for 30.24 percent of the total production during the year.
- Sultan Kudarat sugarcane's production increased by 19.24 percent from 82,795 metric tons produced in 2019 to 98,725 metric tons in 2020.
- In 2020 as of January 1, chicken inventory in Sultan Kudarat recorded 620,412 birds, posted an increase of 3,879 birds than its 616,533 birds in 2019 of the same period.
- Sultan Kudarat is the top raiser of ducks in SOCCSKSARGEN as of January 1, 2020. The total number of ducks in the province accounted for 46.33 percent of the total duck inventory recorded in the region. From 729,524 birds in January 1, 2019, ducks inventory in the province decreased to 673,612 birds in the same period of 2020.
- As of January 1 2020, inventory of carabaos in Sultan Kudarat reported 65,160 heads, decreased of 2,014 heads from its 67,174 heads recorded the same period of the previous year.
- As of January 1 2020, inventory of cattles in Sultan Kudarat recorded 39,161 heads, lower by (1.18) percent than the 39,629 heads accounted in the same period of 2019.
- The inventory of goats in the province posted an increase of 1,493 heads as of January 1, 2020 from its 52,675 heads reported in the same period of the previous year.

- In 2020 as of January 1, hog inventory in Sultan Kudarat recorded 73,713 heads, higher by 3.40 percent than its total inventory of 71,286 heads in 2019 of the same period.
- Fisheries production in Sultan Kudarat in 2020 recorded 6,413 metric tons, lower by (26.17) percent from 8,686 metric tons in 2019. About 4,134 metric tons (64.46%) of the total production recorded from municipal fisheries, the 1,838 metric tons (28.66%) from aquaculture and 441 metric tons (6.88%) from commercial fisheries

- In SY 2017-2018 public elementary schools in Sultan Kudarat excluding Tacurong City was numbered at 331. Of the 331 public elementary schools in the province, 276 were considered complete elementary schools, 29 were classified complete elementary central schools, 13 were incomplete elementary schools, 2 were incomplete primary schools, and 1 complete primary school.
- During the same school year, Sultan Kudarat excluding Tacurong City had a total of 80 public secondary schools, 52 of which were classified as schools with no annexes, 11 as mother schools, and 19 were considered annex schools. An annex school has its own campus but administratively under a school called main school.
- Public elementary enrolment for SY 2017-2018 in Sultan Kudarat reached 101,209 lower by 7,230 from the previous school year's enrolment.
- In SY 2017-2018, Sultan Kudarat recorded 45,069 enrollees in public secondary schools, a decrease of 860 students or 1.87 percent compared to the previous school year.

- In 2020, influenza was the leading cause of morbidity in Sultan Kudarat. The disease afflicted 22,416 persons during the year and on the average about 29,509 persons per year from the period 2016-2020. Aside from influenza, the other leading causes of morbidity in the province in 2020 were), Hypertensive Vascular Diseases (13,417 cases), Animal Bites (10,418 cases), Pneumonia (6,847 cases) and Bronchitis / Bronchiolitis (6,366 cases).
- The top cause of mortality in Sultan Kudarat in 2020 was Hypertensive Vascular Disease which caused the loss of 652 lives or about 76.24 deaths for every 100 thousand population in the province. The other leading causes of mortality in the province in 2020 were Renal/Kidney Diseases which claimed 304 lives; Cancer, 265 lives; myocardial infarction, 232 lives; Accident and violence which resulted to 206 deaths; Pneumonia, 191 deaths, Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease; 133 lives and Diabetes Mellitus, 132 deaths.
- From 2016-2020, prematurity, pneumonia, and septicemia were the top three leading causes of infant deaths in Sultan Kudarat. In 2020, about 17 infants lost their lives due to prematurity; 12 died of pneumonia; and 12 deaths due to septicemia.
- Among mothers in Sultan Kudarat, hypertension in pregnancy/pre/post eclampsia and post-partum hemorrhage were the leading causes of maternal deaths in 2020, hypertension in pregnancy/pre/post eclampsia with two (3) cases and post-partum hemorrhage with four (2) cases.
- In 2020, 155,483 households in Sultan Kudarat had access to sanitary toilets or about 79.77 percent of the total households in the province. Access of households to safe water supply increased to 176,027 households in 2020 from 164,969 households in 2019.
- Contraceptive Prevalence Rate (CPR) in 2020 was reported 93.39 percent, up from 88.47 percent recorded in 2019, and 82.67 percent in 2018.
- In terms of access to basic sanitation facilities, only 68.19 percent of the households had basic sanitation facilities in 2020.
- In 2020, the number of public health workers, including plantilla/permanent hospital and field workers in Sultan Kudarat was 191 Nurses, 150 Midwives, 68 Doctors, 12 Dentists and 1,960 BHWs.
- In 2020, Sultan Kudarat had 25 private hospitals and 4 government hospitals.

- In 2019, reported incidence of crimes in Sultan Kudarat decreased to 1,511 cases, lower than the reported 2,035 total crimes in 2018. About 30.91 percent and 47.32 percent of the cases reported in the province were classified as index crimes and non-index crimes, respectively and the remaining 21.77 percent were public safety index crimes.
- About 66.18 percent of the total crimes reported in Sultan Kudarat in 2019 were considered solved. Solved cases include those filed with the prosecutor's office/proper court with at least one of the suspects arrested.

For indicators where higher levels are desirable such as local government financial resources, agricultural production, access to water facilities, data and rates were ranked from highest to lowest. Indicators where lower levels are desired such as population density, mortality rate, and other related indicators, data and rates were ranked from lowest to highest. For same indicators where two or more city/municipalities have the same levels were given same rank.

General Information

- Per Department of Finance Order No. 23-2008 dated July 29, 2008, Sultan Kudarat has six (6) first class municipalities, three (3) second class municipalities and two (2) third class municipalities. Its component and lone city, Tacurong, has been categorized as a fourth class city.
- Based on the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (CPH), the municipality of Isulan, being the province's capital, had the highest population at 97,490 while Columbio had the lowest population at 33,527
- Based on the 2020 CPH, Lambayong was the most densely populated municipality in Sultan Kudarat with about 369 persons residing per square kilometer of land. Columbio, on the otherhand, was the least densely populated municipality in the province with about 36 persons for every square kilometer.
- Among the 249 barangays, Kalawag II (Poblacion) in Isulan had the highest population at 16,769 followed by Poblacion in City of Tacurong at 15,696. Makat (Sumali Pas) in Columbio had the lowest number of people at 554.
- In 2019, live births by place of occurrence in Sultan Kudarat was noticed in Municipality of Isulan with a total of 4,437 live births followed by City of Tacurong with 2,613 live births and Municipality of Lebak with 868 live births. The least live birth by place of occurrence was in Municipality Pres. Quirino with a total of 36 live births.
- In 2019, live births by usual residence of mother in Sultan Kudarat was highest in City of Tacurong with 1,889 live births, followed by Municipality of Isulan with 1,686 live births, Lambayong 1,383 live births, Bagumbayan with 1,276 and Lebak 1,093 live births. The least was recorded by Municipality of Columbio with 460 live births.
- In 2019, marriages by place of occurrence in Sultan Kudarat was highest in Municipality of Isulan with 475 marriages, followed by City of Tacurong with 429 marriages, Lebak, 360 marriages, Esperanza with 284 marriages, and Senator Ninoy Aquino with 237 marriages. The least was recorded by Municipality of Lutayan with 29 marriages

- From 2018-2019, Isulan consistently edged the other 10 municipalities in Sultan Kudarat in terms of total income. Isulan's total income in 2019 reached ₱ 363.45 million or about ₱ 33.37 million more than the total income realized in 2018. Pres. Quirino, on the other hand, had the lowest income among the municipalities in the province at ₱ 141.61 million.
- Isulan, which is more urbanized compared to the other municipalities in the province, was able to collect ₱ 52.98 million worth of tax revenues in 2019. Palimbang generated the lowest tax revenues at ₱ 1.88 million.
- Among the municipalities, Isulan posted the highest expenditures in 2019 at ₱ 268.6 million, about ₱ 8.2 million higher than the amount it expended in 2018.
- Municipality of Palimbang spent the highest for health, nutrition and population control at ₱ 26.45 million in 2019, followed by Isulan with ₱25.18 million.
- In 2019, Lutayan spent the highest for social services and welfare at ₱ 76.02 million. Isulan, on the other hand, spent the highest on economic services at ₱ 62.91 million.

Education

The Countryside in Figures: Sultan Kudarat, 2021 Edition

- As of SY 2017-2018, there were 321 public elementary schools in Sultan Kudarat, 276 were classified as complete elementary schools while the rest were either incomplete primary schools (2), complete primary schools (1), incomplete elementary schools (13) or complete elementary central schools (29). The municipalities with most number of elementary schools were Bagumbayan with 40; Lebak, 39; and Sen. Ninoy Aquino, 38.
- As of SY 2017-2018 there were 80 nationally-funded public secondary schools in Sultan Kudarat, 52 of which were main/independent schools while 19 were categorized as annex secondary schools.
- In SY 2017-2018, Sultan Kudarat had a total public elementary enrolment of 118,907 about 1.03 percent lower than the previous school year. Lebak, with 16,013 enrollees on the said school year, accounted for the biggest public elementary enrolment at 13.47 percent. Aside from Lebak, the other two municipalities with the highest enrolment were Isulan (13,080) and Palimbang (10,907). Columbio had the lowest number of enrollees with 5,401 pupils while its component city Tacurong had 13,753 enrollees during the said school year.
- In SY 2017-2018, Sultan Kudarat had a total public secondary enrolment of 45,069. Isulan, with 4,995 enrollees on the said school year, accounted for the biggest public elementary enrolment at 11.08 percent. Aside from Isulan, the other two municipalities with the highest enrolment were Esperanza (4,912) and Lebak (4,658). Sen. Ninoy Aquino had the lowest number of enrollees with 1,940 students while its component city Tacurong had 7,337 enrollees during the said school year.

Poverty Situation

The Countryside in Figures: Sultan Kudarat, 2021 Edition

- In 2012, six (6) of the 11 municipalities in Sultan Kudarat had at least half of their population considered poor. Palimbang had the most number of poor as 58 for every 100 of its constituents were considered poor. Aside from Palimbang, in the top five in terms of poverty incidence in Sultan Kudarat were Columbio (54.7), Sen. Ninoy Aquino (54.6), Lebak (51.3) and Kalamansig (51.0).
- Except for Lutayan and Palimbang, poverty situation in the municipalities worsened from 2009 to 2012. Lambayong registered the highest increase with 9.5 percentage points followed by Sen. Ninoy Aquino 7.0 percentage points increase and Esperanza with 5.4 percentage points increase. On the other hand, Lutayan was able to cut the incidence of poverty by 9.0 percentage points from 51.1 in 2009 to 42.1 in 2012, Palimbang also was able to cut the incidence from 63.7 in 2009 to 57.6 in 2012.
- The least poor municipalities in Sultan Kudarat in 2012 were Isulan (with 29.9 poverty incidence) followed by President Quirino (32.7 %).
- In terms of degree of poorness or severity of poverty, this was remarkably noted in the municipalities of Sen. Ninoy Aquino at 9.5 percent followed by Palimbang (8.8%), Bagumbayan (7.9%), Columbio (7.3%) and Kalamansig (7.0%)
- In terms of poverty gap or the average increase in total income needed, which when appropriately distributed to the lower income groups will eliminate poverty, the cost of eradicating poverty when shared by each family was heaviest in Sen. Ninoy Aquino at 21.7 percent income shortfall with respect to the poverty threshold. This means that we need to increase the income of the poor families in Sen. Ninoy Aquino by 21.7 percent, 20.4 percent in Palimbang, 18.5 percent in Bagumbayan, 17.4 percent in Columbio (17.4%), 16.9 percent in Kalamansig, 16.8 percent in Esperanza (16.8%) to elevate them from the poverty line.
- In 2003, the biggest improvement in terms of reducing income shortfall with respect to the poverty line (poverty gap) was noted among poor families in Lebak with a reduction of 13.9 percentage points from 2000. Lebak was followed by Lutayan (12.6 percentage points), Columbio (11.5 percentage points), and Kalamansig (11.4 percentage points).

Housing

- In 2015, about 100,450 of the 184,650 households in Sultan Kudarat had houses that were built on lots owned/being amortized. These group of households decreased by 12.36 percent from 2010 figures. About 11.77 percent of the households whose residential lots were owned or being amortized were located in the City of Tacurong; about 10.36 percent in Bagumbayan, about 10.32 percent were in Isulan, and about 9.84 percent in Lebak.
- The total occupied housing units in Sultan Kudarat in 2015 reached 184,650 or an increase of 9.32 percent from the number of units recorded five years ago.
- In 2015, the number of occupied housing units with roofs made of galvanized iron/aluminum constituted 63.28 percent of the households in Sultan Kudarat. This group of housing units increased by 22.21 percent from five years ago.
 - Among the Municipalities in sultan Kudarat, Palimbang had the highest percentage of housing units with roofs made of cogon/nipa/anhaw with 22.77, followed by Lebak with 12.62 percent. A total of 203 houses had roof made of makeshift/salvaged/improvised materials.

Public Order and Safety

- Municipality of Lutayan remained the lowest index crime incidence with 6 cases from 2018-2020 while Isulan posted the highest with 36 index crime incidence among the 11 municipalities in the province. Index crimes include actual crimes of murder, homicide, physical injury (serious and less serious), robbery, theft, and rape.
- In 2020, among the 11 municipality the lowest non-index crime incidence was noted in Lutayan with 38 cases while Isulan had the highest with 210 cases. Non-index crimes include negligent manslaughter, non-aggravated assault, forgery & counterfeiting, fraud, embezzlement, stolen property, vandalism, weapons, prostitution & common law vice, sex offenses, narcotic laws, gambling, offenses against family & children, driving under the influence of liquor, disorderly conduct, and all other crimes not listed under index crimes.
- in 2019 the policeman to population ratio was highest in the municipality of Palimbang at 2,443 person per police officer while the ratio was lowest in Pres. Quirino at 752 person per police officer.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Household – a social unit consisting of a person living alone or a group of persons who sleep in the same housing unit and have a common arrangement in the preparation and consumption of food.

Household Population – the population enumerated in private households during a census.

Household Size – number of usual members in a private household.

Human Development Index – a measure of how well a country has performed, not only in terms of real income growth, but also in terms of social indicators of people's ability to lead a long and healthy life, to acquire knowledge and skills, and to have access to the resources needed to afford a decent standard of living.

Medium Assumption – moderate fertility decline and mortality decline.

Population – total number of individuals in a territory at a specified time. It covers both nationals and aliens, native and foreign-born persons, internees, refugees and any other group physically present within the borders of a country at a specified time. In assembling national demographic statistics for publication, the basic aim has been to obtain data for the physically present (or de facto) population rather than for the legally established resident (or de jure) inhabitants.

Population Census – the total process of collecting, compiling, evaluating, analyzing and publishing demographic, economic and social data pertaining to all persons in the country or in a well-limited territory.

Population Density – refers to the number of persons per unit of land area (usually in square kilometers). This measure is more meaningful if given as population per unit of arable land.

Population Growth Rate – indicates how fast a population increases or decreases as a result of the interplay of births, deaths, and migration during a given period of time. Where the population is closed, meaning no migration, the population growth rate is the same as the rate of natural increase, i.e., the difference between the number of births and the number of deaths during a specified period of time. The three methods for computing the rate of growth based on the assumption with respect to the change are: arithmetic change, geometric change and exponential change.

Population Projection – computation of future changes in population numbers, given certain assumptions about future trends in the rates of fertility, mortality and migration. Demographers often publish high, medium, and low projections of the same population based on different assumptions of how these rates will change in the future.

INCOME AND POVERTY SITUATION

Consumer Price Index (CPI) – measure of the average changes in the prices of a fixed basket of goods and services usually purchased by households for their consumption.

Family – a group of persons usually living together and composed of the head and other persons related to the head by blood, marriage or adoption. It includes both the nuclear and extended family.

Family expenditures – refer to the expenses or disbursements made by the family purely for personal consumption during the calendar year. They exclude all expenses in relation to farm or business operation, investment ventures, purchase of real property and other disbursements which do not involve personal consumption.

Family size – number of members present in the family.

Magnitude of the Poor – the number of families or the population whose annual per capita income falls below the subsistence/poverty threshold.

Per Capita Income – is obtained by dividing the total family income by the number family members.

Poverty Incidence – proportion of families/population whose annual per capita income falls below the annual per capita poverty threshold to the total number of families/population.

Poverty Threshold – annual per capita income required or the amount to be spent to satisfy nutritional requirements (2,000 Kcal) and other basic needs.

Poverty Gap – the total income/expenditure shortfall (expressed in proportion to the poverty threshold) of families/individuals with income/expenditure below the poverty threshold, divided by the total number of families/individuals.

Subsistence Incidence – proportion of families/population whose annual per capita income falls below the annual per capita food/subsistence threshold to the total number of families/population.

Subsistence and Food Threshold – annual per capita income required or the amount to be spent to satisfy nutritional requirements (2,000 Kcal).

Total Family Income – includes primary income and receipts from other sources received by all family members during the calendar year as participants in any economic activity or as recipients of transfers, pensions, grants, etc.

AGRICULTURE

Agricultural Production – the growing field crops, fruits, nuts, seeds, tree nurseries (except those of forest trees), bulb vegetables and flowers, both in the open and under glass; and the production of coffee, tea, cocoa, rubber; and the production of livestock and livestock products, honey rabbits, fur-bearing animals, silkworm, cocoons, etc. Forestry and fishery production carried on as an ancillary activity on an agricultural holding is also considered as agricultural production.

Aquaculture – sector of fisheries that includes the rearing or raising under controlled conditions of aquatic products such as fish, oysters, mussels, sea weeds and other aquatic resources in sea, lakes and rivers. Examples are fishponds, fish pens and fish cages.

Commercial Fishing – sector of fisheries that includes the catching of fish in marine waters with the use of fishing boat of more than three (3) gross tons and beyond the seven (7) kilometers shoreline limit.

Municipal Fishing – sector of fisheries that includes the catching of fish in marine and inland waters with the use of fishing boat of three (3) gross tons or less, or using gear not requiring the use of boats.

HEALTH

Infant Mortality Rate – the annual number of deaths of infants under one year of age per 1,000 live births.

Maternal Death – the death of woman while pregnant or within 42 days of termination of pregnancy, irrespective of the duration and the site of the pregnancy or its management, but not from accidental or incidental causes.

Maternal Mortality Rate – the annual number of deaths of women from pregnancy-related causes per 100,000 live births.

Morbidity – any departure, subjective or objective, from a stage of physiological well-being.

Mortality Rate – generally expresses the chance that death will occur during a particular period to a person in particular population group alive at the beginning of the period. As such, those rates are true probabilities and describe precisely the risk of dying for any actual cohort.

EDUCATION

Cohort Survival Rate – the percentage of enrollees at the beginning grade or year in a given school year who reached the final grade or year of the elementary/secondary level.

Completion Rate – the percentage of first grade/year entrants in a level of education who complete/finish the level in accordance with the required number of years of study.

Dropout Rate – the percentage of pupils/students who leave school during the year for any reason as well as those who complete the previous grade/year level but fail to enroll in the next grade/year level the following school year to the total number of pupils/students enrolled during the previous school year.

Enrolment – the total number of students who have registered as of August 31 in a given school year.

Net Enrolment Ratio – the ratio of the enrolment for the age group corresponding to the official school age in the elementary/secondary level to the population of the same age group in a given year. Also known as Participation Rate.

Transition Rate – the percentage of enrollees/graduates in a level of education in a given school year who moved on to the next higher level the following year.

Repetition rate - this is an EFA indicator which determines the magnitude of pupils/students who repeat a grade/year level.

PUBLIC ORDER AND SAFETY

Crime Incidence – the number of crimes reported as to index or non-index crimes within a given period.

Crime Rate – number of crimes committed per 10,000 population.

Index Crimes – crimes which are sufficiently significant and which occur with sufficient regularity to be meaningful. Crimes which include the following: murder, physical injury, robbery, theft and rape.

Non – Index Crimes – all types of crimes not considered as index crimes.

PUBLIC FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Annual Income – refers to revenues and receipts realized by provinces, cities and municipalities from the regular sources of Local General fund inclusive of IRA and other shares provided for in Section 284, section 290 and Section 291 of the Local Government Code of 1991 or RA No. 7160, exclusive, however, of non-recurring receipts such as national aids, grants, financial assistance, loan proceeds, sales of assets, and other. As provided for under Section 1 and Section 2 of Executive Order No. 249, dated July 25, 1987, provinces, cities and municipalities, except Manila and Quezon City which shall remain special class cities, shall be divided into six (6) main classes according to the average annual income realized during the last four calendar years immediately preceding the year of re-classification. Based on the Financial Statement of the LGUs for CY 2004-2007 of the Commission on Audit, the income brackets of provinces, cities and municipalities which shall be used in their re-classification are ranged, as follows:

Province:

1 st	P450M or more
2 nd	P360M or more but less than P450M
3 rd	P270M or more but less than P360M
4 th	P180M or more but less than P270M
5 th	P90M or more but less than P290M
6 th	Below P90M

City:

2 nd	P320M or more but less than P400M
3 rd	P240M or more but less than P320M
4 th	P160M or more but less than P240M
5 th	P80M or more but less than P160M

Municipality:

3 rd	P35M or more but less than P45M

Grants – all non-repayable transfers received from other levels of government or from private individuals, or institutions including reparations and gifts given for particular projects or programs, or for general budget support.

Non-Tax Revenue – revenue collected from sources other than compulsory tax levies. Includes those collected in exchange for direct services rendered by government agencies to the public, or those arising from the government's regulatory and investment activities.

Personal Services – provisions for the payment of salaries, wages and other compensation (e.g., merit, salary increase, cost of living allowances, honoraria and commutable allowances) of permanent, temporary, contractual and casual employees of the government.

Revenue – a cash inflow which does not increase the liability of the government.

Taxes on Income and Profit – taxes imposed on all taxable income earned or received by a taxpayer whether an individual, partnership, or corporation, during a particular period of time, usually lasting one year.

Taxes on Property – taxes imposed on the ownership of wealth or immovable properties and on the transfer of real or personal properties, both tangible and intangible.
