The cover of The Countryside in Figures (CIF) Sultan Kudarat Province 2023 Edition has been enhanced to showcase and promote the various products and tourism sites of Sultan Kudarat Province.

In this 2023 edition, it features the coffee product of Sultan Kudarat Province being tagged as the “Coffee Capital” of the Philippines. In the 2022 data of the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA), SOCCSKSARGEN Region has the widest area devoted to coffee production in the country with 26,179 hectares planted to the said crop. Of this area, 20,737 hectares or 79 percent are in the province of Sultan Kudarat. Sultan Kudarat Province is the top coffee producer in the country, contributing about 31 percent share of Philippine’s coffee production in 2022.

Brief Information about the PSA

The Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) was established on September 12, 2013 pursuant to Republic Act (RA) 10625, otherwise known as the Philippine Statistical Act of 2013. The PSA is a merger of four (4) government statistical agencies namely: National Statistics Office (NSO), National Statistical Coordination Board (NSCB), Bureau of Agricultural Statistics (BAS) and Bureau of Labor and Employment Statistics (BLES).

Mandate

The PSA shall primarily be responsible for the implementation of the objectives and provisions of R.A. 10625, R.A. 11055, and R.A. 11315.

It shall plan, develop, prescribe, disseminate, and enforce policies, rules and regulations, and coordinate government-wide programs governing the production of official statistics, general purpose statistics, civil registration services and inclusive identification system.

It shall be responsible for all national censuses and surveys, sectoral statistics, community-based statistics, consolidation of selected administrative recording systems, and compilation of national accounts.

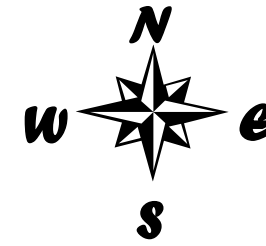

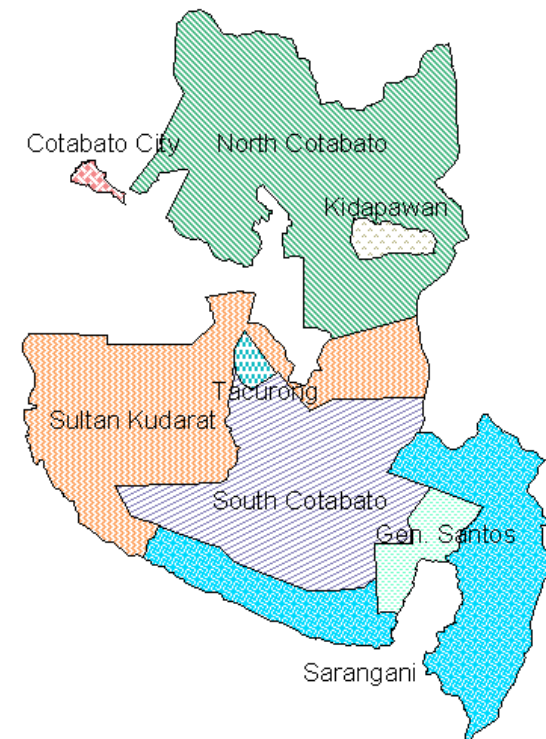

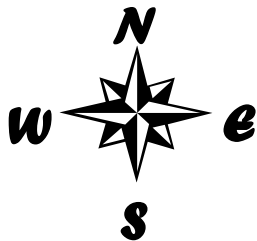
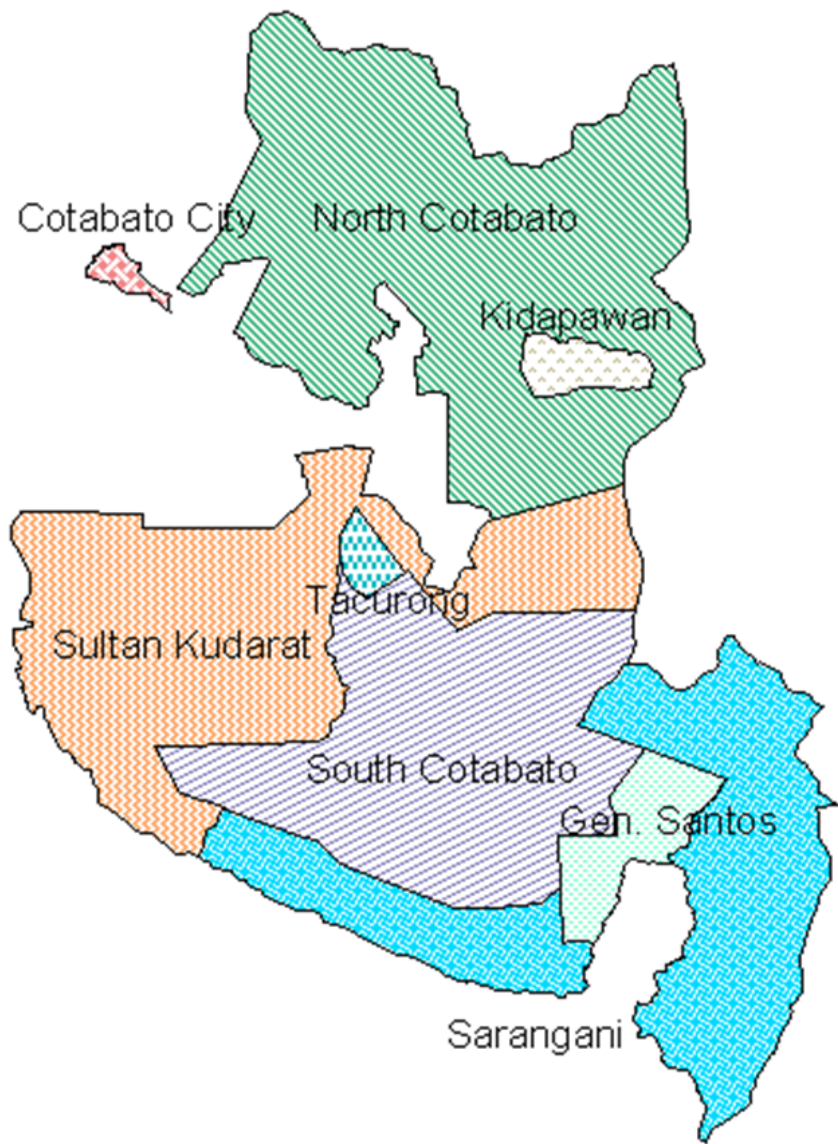
MAP OF PHILIPPINES IDENTIFYING THE LOCATION OF REGION XII - SOCCSKSARGEN



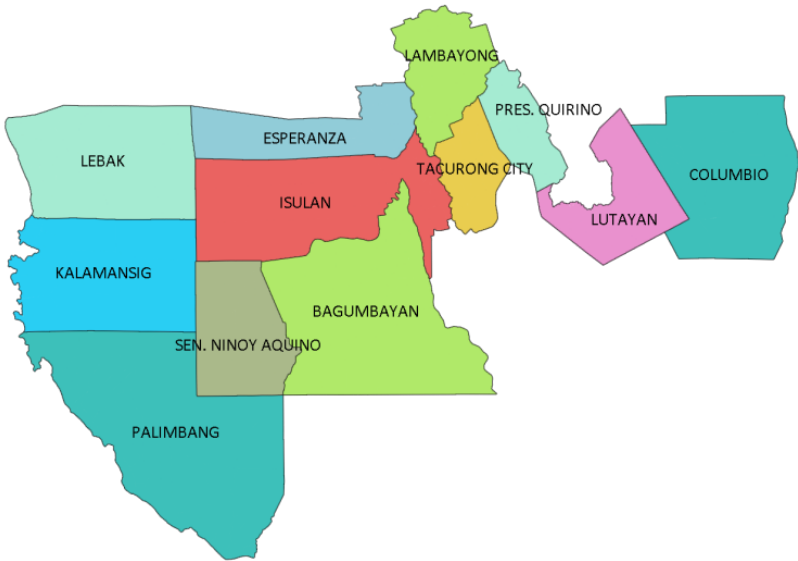

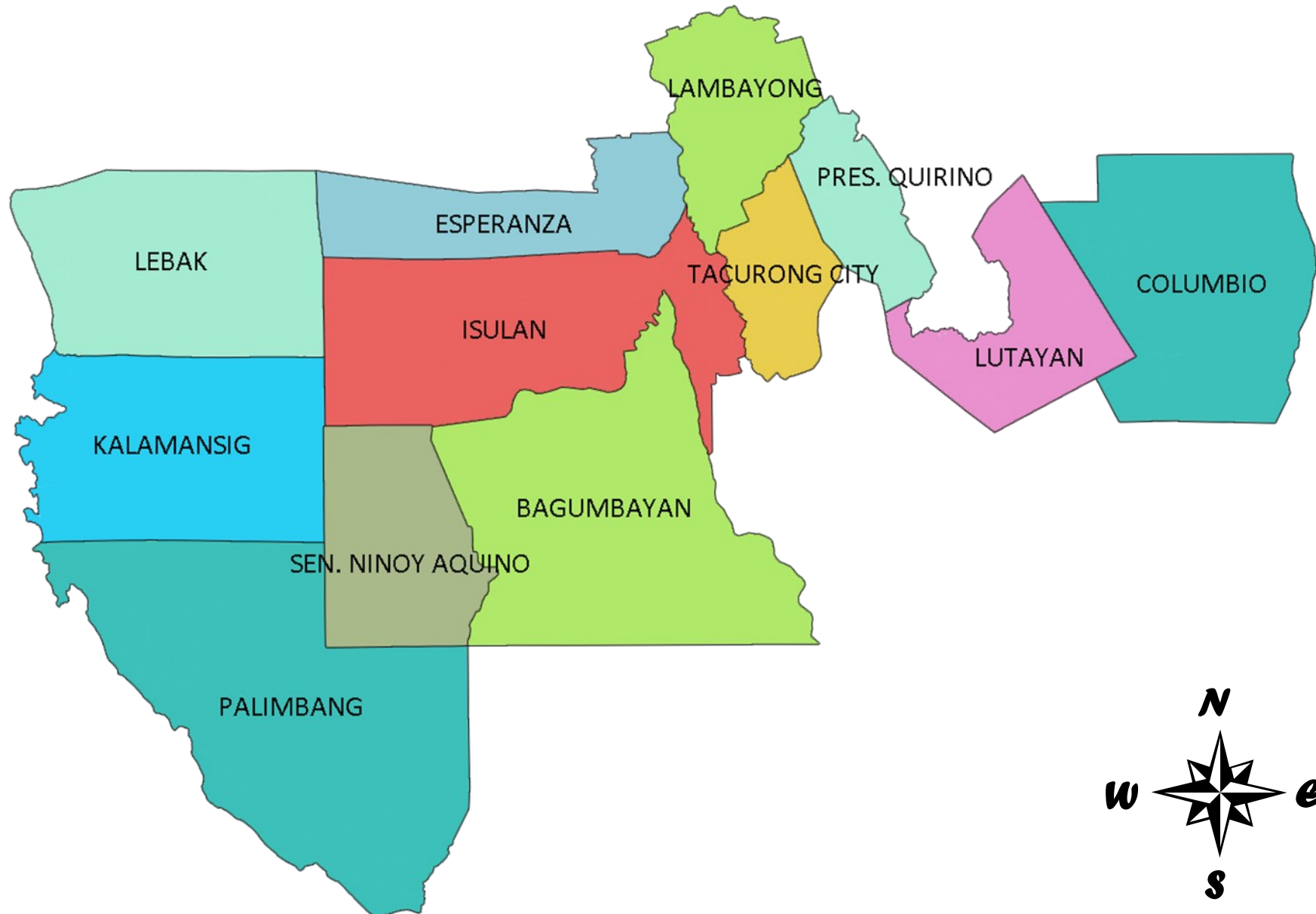
**MAP OF THE SOCCSKSARGEN REGION IDENTIFYING THE

PROFILE OF SULTAN KUDARAT PROVINCE

The Province of Sultan Kudarat was created on November 22, 1973 pursuant to Presidential Decree No. 341.

The Province is named after the famous sultan of Maguindanao, Sultan Mohammed Dipatuan Kudarat. It is composed of 11 municipalities and one city. It is situated between the provinces of Maguindanao and Cotabato on the north and South Cotabato and Sarangani on the south. In 2020 Census of Population and Housing (2020 CPH), the province has a total population of 854,052 and 202,813 households with an average household size of 4.2 members.

The province has a total land area of 5,363.86 sq. km. The soil topography of the province ranges from plain and rolling to hilly and mountainous. The coastal towns of Lebak, Kalamansig and Palimbang in the western side are lined by mountain ranges that wall the central portion of the province from the sea. Its soils are favorable for the cultivation of all kinds of crops especially for rice and corn. Major crops are palay, corn, coffee, coconut, banana, african palm oil and sugar cane. Climate in the province is characterized by a short dry season of one to three months while the rainfall is evenly distributed throughout the year. The province is considered free from typhoons.

The province has some of the richest fishing grounds and vast brackish and fresh water areas in the region. The Celebes Sea at the western side of the province is the major source of fish including bangus and tuna fish. Others are Lake Buluan, existing marsh areas and numerous rivers and creeks.

The province is blessed with abundant water resources that could be utilized for drinking water, irrigation, hydropower and inland fish production and recreation purposes. There are 16 known big rivers including Ala River, Lulaman and Kabulnan rivers.

General Information

- As of December 31, 2016, Sultan Kudarat is composed of 11 municipalities, one (1) city and 249 barangays. Tacurong City, its component city, has 20 barangays. Among the municipalities, Palimbang has the biggest number of barangays with 40, followed by Lebak, and Lambayong (Don Mariano Marcos) with 27 and 26 barangays, respectively.
- Based on the 2020 Census of Population, Sultan Kudarat with a total land area of 5,363.86 sq. km has a total population of 854,052. Lambayong, with 369 persons per square kilometer, is the most densely populated among the municipalities in the province. Columbio, at 36 persons for every square kilometer, is the least densely populated. Tacurong City has a population density of 713 persons per square kilometer.
- In 2021, registered live births by place of occurrence in Sultan Kudarat Province dropped by 310 from 11,074 in 2020 to 10,764 in 2021. Out of 10,764 births, 9,718 were attended by health professionals, 1,018 by traditional birth attendants, and 28 by others.
- In 2021, the number of registered live births by usual residence of mother in Sultan Kudarat Province was 11,019 births, a decrease of 66 births from the previous year's total of 11,085 births. About 9,951 births in 2021 were attended by health professionals, followed by 1,042 births attended by traditional birth attendants and 26 births by others.

- Per Department of Finance Order No. 23-2008 dated July 29, 2008, Sultan Kudarat Province remained to be a first class province since 2005.
- Based on 2022, Sultan Kudarat's total income amounted to P2.92 billion, up from P2.10 billion in 2021.
- Based on 2022, Sultan Kudarat collected a total tax revenue of P104.06 million, higher than its P80.87 million total tax revenues in 2021.
- Total expenditures of Sultan Kudarat in 2022 amounted to P2.57 billion. Health, Nutrition and Population Control had the largest share of expenditures, accounting for approximately P834.75 million of total expenditures, followed by P727.18 million for General Public Services. The least expenditures were spent on education, culture, and sports/manpower development.

Income & Poverty Situation

The Countryside in Figures: Sultan Kudarat Province, 2023 Edition

- The poverty incidence among families in Sultan Kudarat, declined from 24.3 percent in 2018 to 23.8 percent in 2021. Similarly, the poverty incidence of population fell from 31.5 percent in 2018 to 30.2 percent in 2021.
- The number of poor families in Sultan Kudarat, however, increased from 46.5 thousand persons in 2018 to 46.9 thousand persons in 2021 or about an addition of 4,000 poor individuals.
- In 2021, the minimum amount needed by an individual living in Sultan Kudarat to support his/her food and non-food basic needs was estimated at P25,295, or 6.39% higher than the P23,775 reported poverty threshold in 2018. Similarly the minimum amount needed by a person to support his/her basic needs also increased from 16,576 in 2018 to 17, 633 in 2021.

Agriculture

- Sultan Kudarat produced 394,006.61 metric tons of palay in 2022, lower by 6.72 percent compared to its 422,381.24 metric tons in 2021.
- Sultan Kudarat produced 247,603.74 metric tons of corn in 2022. Corn production in 2022 was higher at 6.61 percent than its previous year's production of 232,244.99 metric tons.
- Sultan Kudarat's coconut production in 2022 recorded 241,875.26 metric tons, 3.61 percent higher than its previous year's production of 233,453.51 metric tons.
- Sultan Kudarat's banana production increased by 213,162.96 metric tons in 2022 from 202,520.27 metric tons in 2021.
- In 2022, Sultan Kudarat produced 122,365.29 metric tons of palm oil (fresh fruit bunch), 8.89 percent higher than its 112,379.72 metric tons in 2021.
- In 2022, Sultan Kudarat produced 9,284.51 metric tons of coffee (green coffee beans), 2.91 percent higher than its 9,022.23 metric tons in 2021. Sultan Kudarat remains as the top coffee producer not only in SOCCSKSARGEN but among all provinces nationwide earning the moniker "Coffee Capital of the Philippines".
- Sultan Kudarat sugarcane's production decreased by 16.22 percent from 93,647.44 metric tons produced in 2021 to 78,459.86 metric tons in 2022.
- In 2022, chicken inventory in Sultan Kudarat recorded 591,389 birds, posted a decreased of 71,072 birds than its 662,461 birds in 2021.
- Sultan Kudarat continued to be the top raiser of ducks in SOCCSKSARGEN. The total number of ducks in the province accounted for 728,711 of the total duck inventories recorded in the region. From 728,876 birds in January 1, 2021, duck's inventory in the province declined to 165 birds in 2022.
- As of January 1, 2022, inventory of carabaos in Sultan Kudarat reported 65,947 heads, increased of 543 heads from its 65,404 heads recorded the same period of the previous year.
- As of January 1, 2022, inventory of cattle in Sultan Kudarat recorded 39,938 heads, increased 1,502 heads from 38,436 accounted in the same period of year 2021.
- The inventory of goats in the province posted an increase of 51 heads as of January 1, 2022 from its 56,928 heads to 56,979 heads in the year 2021.
- As of January 1, 2022, Sultan Kudarat's hog inventory stood at 71,212 heads, recorded an increase of 1,944 from the previous year's total inventory of 73,156 heads.
- Fisheries production in Sultan Kudarat in 2022 recorded 13,722 metric tons, up 1,347 from 12,375 metric tons in 2021.

The Countryside in Figures: Sultan Kudarat Province, 2023 Edition

- In SY 2021-2022 public elementary schools in Sultan Kudarat was numbered at 343. Of the 343 public elementary schools in the province, 310 were considered complete elementary schools, 29 were classified complete elementary central schools, and 4 were incomplete elementary schools.
- During the same school year, Sultan Kudarat had a total of 52 public secondary schools, 8 of which were classified mother school, 36 as school with no annexes, and 8 were considered annex schools. An annex school has its own campus but administratively under a school called main school.
- Public elementary enrolment for SY 2021-2022 in Sultan Kudarat reached 100,553 lower by 9,932 from the previous school year's enrolment.
- In SY 2021-2022, Sultan Kudarat recorded 67,285 enrollees in public secondary schools, lower by 3,198 students compared to the previous school year.

- In 2021, influenza was the leading cause of morbidity in Sultan Kudarat. The disease afflicted 17,672 persons during the year and on the average about 29,467 persons per year from the period 2017-2021. Aside from influenza, other leading causes of morbidity in the province in 2021 were, Animal Bites (11,547 cases), Hypertensive Vascular Diseases (8,558 cases), Covid 19 (6,532 cases), Wounds (4,902 cases) and Bronchitis / Bronchiolitis (4,640 cases).
- The top cause of mortality in Sultan Kudarat in 2021 was Hypertensive Vascular Disease which caused the loss of 460 lives or about 53 deaths for every 100 thousand population in the province. The other leading causes of mortality in the province in 2021 were Renal/Kidney Diseases which claimed 380 lives; Arrhythmia 305 deaths, Pneumonia, 258 lives; myocardial infarction, 258 lives; Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease which resulted to 258 deaths; and Cancer, 221 deaths.
- From 2017-2021, prematurity, septicemia, and pneumonia, were the top three leading causes of infant deaths in Sultan Kudarat. In 2021, about 24 infants lost their lives due to prematurity; 19 died of septicemia; and 15 deaths due to Pneumonia.
- Among mothers in Sultan Kudarat, hypertension in pregnancy/pre/post eclampsia and post-partum hemorrhage were the leading causes of maternal deaths in 2021, hypertension in pregnancy/pre/post eclampsia with three (3) cases.
- Contraceptive Prevalence Rate (CPR) in 2021 was reported 95.10 percent, up from 93.39 percent recorded in 2020, and 88.47 percent in 2019.
- In 2022, the number of public health workers, including plantilla/permanent hospital and field workers in Sultan Kudarat was 316 Nurses, 254 Midwives, 90 Doctors, 12 Dentists and 1,859 BHWs.
- In 2022, Sultan Kudarat had 25 private hospitals and 4 government hospitals.

- In 2022, reported incidence of crimes in Sultan Kudarat decreased to 1,515 cases, lower than the reported 1,549 total crimes in 2020. About 248 and 984 of the cases reported in the province were classified as index crimes and non-index crimes, respectively and 283 reported as public safety index crimes.
- About 97.49 percent of the total crimes reported in Sultan Kudarat in 2022 were considered solved. Solved cases include those filed with the prosecutor's office/proper court with at least one of the suspects arrested.

The Countryside in Figures: Sultan Kudarat Province, 2023 Edition

- Per Department of Finance Order No. 23-2008 dated July 29, 2008, Sultan Kudarat has six (6) first class municipalities, three (3) second class municipalities and two (2) third class municipalities. Its component and lone city, Tacurong, has been categorized as a fourth class city.
- Based on the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (CPH), the municipality of Isulan, being the province's capital, had the highest population at 97,490 while Columbio had the lowest population at 33,527
- Based on the 2020 CPH, Lambayong was the most densely populated municipality in Sultan Kudarat with about 369 persons residing per square kilometer of land. Columbio, on the otherhand, was the least densely populated municipality in the province with about 36 persons for every square kilometer.
- Among the 249 barangays, Kalawag II (Poblacion) in Isulan had the highest population at 16,769 followed by Poblacion in City of Tacurong at 15,696. Makat (Sumali Pas) in Columbio had the lowest number of people at 554.
- In 2021, for live births by place of occurrence in Sultan Kudarat, the Municipality of Isulan with a total of 4,455 live births rated first, followed by City of Tacurong with 1,517 live births and Municipality of Palimbang with 761 live births. The least live birth by place of occurrence was recorded in Municipality Pres. Quirino with a total of 51 live births.
- In 2021, live births by usual residence of mother in Sultan Kudarat was highest in the City of Tacurong with 1,575 live births, followed by Municipality of Isulan with 1,517 live births, Bagumbayan 1,221 live births, Lambayong with 1,055 and Lebak 1,004 live births. The least was recorded by Municipality of Columbio with 434 live births.
- In 2021, marriages classified by place of occurrence in Sultan Kudarat was highest in the Municipality of Lebak with 386 registered marriages, followed by Municipality of Isulan with 360 marriages, Tacurong City, 355 marriages, and Senator Ninoy Aquino with 318 marriages. The least number of registered marriages was recorded in the Municipality of Lutayan with only 29 marriages.

- From 2019-2022, Isulan consistently edged the other 10 municipalities in Sultan Kudarat in terms of total income. Isulan's total income in 2022 reached ₱ 554.50 million. Pres. Quirino, on the other hand, had the lowest income among the municipalities in the province at ₱ 226.93 million.
- Isulan, which is more urbanized compared to the other municipalities in the province, was able to collect ₱ 68.929 million worth of tax revenues in 2022. Lutayan generated the lowest tax revenues at ₱ 3.11 million.
- Among the municipalities, Palimbang posted the highest expenditures in 2022 at ₱ 417.86 million, about ₱ 126.36 million higher than the amount it expended in 2021.
- Municipality of Palimbang spent the highest for health, nutrition and population control at ₱ 39.21 million in 2022, followed by Bagumbayan with ₱ 36.256 million.
- In 2022, Lutayan still spent the highest for social services and welfare at ₱ 104.19 million. Lebak, on the other hand, spent the highest on economic services at ₱ 98.66 million.

Education

The Countryside in Figures: Sultan Kudarat Province, 2023 Edition

- As of SY 2021-2022, there were 369 public elementary schools in Sultan Kudarat, 332 were classified as complete elementary schools while the rest were either complete elementary central schools (33) or incomplete primary schools (4). The municipalities with the most number of elementary schools were Bagumbayan with 42; Sen. Ninoy Aquino, 40 and Lebak 40.
- In SY 2021-2022, Sultan Kudarat had a total public elementary enrolment of 113,703 about 2,918 higher than the previous school year. Among the municipalities, Lebak, with 14,354 enrollees on the said school year, accounted for the biggest public elementary enrolment. Aside from Lebak, the other three municipalities with the highest enrolment were Isulan (12,459), Bagumbayan (10,432) and Palimbang (10,234). Columbio had the lowest number of enrollees with 5,099 pupils while its component city Tacurong had 13,150 enrollees during the said school year.
- In SY 2021-2022, Sultan Kudarat had a total public secondary enrolment for Junior Highschool of 56,872. Among the municipalities, Lebak, with 6,381 enrollees on the said school year, accounted for the biggest public secondary junior high school enrolment. Aside from Lebak, the other two municipalities with the highest enrolment were Isulan (6,134) and Esperanza (6,114). Sen. Ninoy Aquino had the lowest number of enrollees with 2,493 students while its component city Tacurong had 7,441 enrollees during the said school year.
- In SY 2021-2022, Sultan Kudarat had a total public secondary enrolment for Senior high school of 16,676. Among the municipalities, Isulan, with 2,171 enrollees on the said school year, accounted for the biggest public secondary senior high school enrolment. Meanwhile, Columbio had the lowest number of enrollees with 494 students while its component city, Tacurong, had 3,188 enrollees during the said school year.

- Among the 11 municipalities in Sultan Kudarat, Pres. Quirino at 15.87 deaths had the highest incidence of infant deaths per 1,000 livebirths in 2021; the lowest was in Palimbang which recorded no infant death for every 1,000 livebirths on the said year.
- At 17.86 deaths, Pres. Quirino had recorded the highest incidence of deaths among children 5 years old and below per 1,000 children on the said age range in 2021. Palimbang on the other hand, had 0.00 deaths per 1,000 children aged 5 years old and below, the lowest in 2021 among the 11 municipalities in Sultan Kudarat.

Poverty Situation

The Countryside in Figures: Sultan Kudarat Province, 2023 Edition

- Since 2009, the Municipality of Palimbang had the most number of poor as 60.5 for every 100 of its constituents were considered poor. Aside from Palimbang, five (5) municipalities in Sultan Kudarat recorded a statistical number of poor individuals at least half of their population also considered poor, those municipalities were Lebak (54.0), Kalamansig (53.8), Lambayong (51.7), Senator Ninoy Aquino (51.0) and Comulbio (50.3).
- In 2018, all municipalities in the province were able to cut their incidence of poverty. Lebak has the highest cut with 19.3 percentage points from 54.0 in 2015 to 34.7 in 2018, followed by Lambayong with a cut of 17.1 percentage points, Columbio with 14.1 percentage points, Senator Ninoy Aquino with a cut of 12.8 percentage points and Kalamansig with 11.6 percentage cut compared to 2015.
- The least poor municipalities in Sultan Kudarat in 2018 were Isulan (with 20.6 poverty incidence) followed by President Quirino (26.7).
- In 2003, in terms of degree of poorness or severity of poverty, this was remarkably noted in the municipalities of Sen. Ninoy Aquino at 9.5 percent followed by Palimbang (8.8%), Bagumbayan (7.9%), Columbio (7.3%) and Kalamansig (7.0%)
- In 2003, in terms of poverty gap or the average increase in total income needed, which when appropriately distributed to the lower income groups will eliminate poverty, the cost of eradicating poverty when shared by each family was heaviest in Sen. Ninoy Aquino at 21.7 percent income shortfall with respect to the poverty threshold. This means that we need to increase the income of the poor families in Sen. Ninoy Aquino by 21.7 percent, 20.4 percent in Palimbang, 18.5 percent in Bagumbayan, 17.4 percent in Columbio (17.4%), 16.9 percent in Kalamansig, 16.8 percent in Esperanza (16.8%) to elevate them from the poverty line.
- In 2003, the biggest improvement in terms of reducing income shortfall with respect to the poverty line (poverty gap) was noted among poor families in Lebak with a reduction of 13.9 percentage points from 2000. Lebak was followed by Lutayan (12.6 percentage points), Columbio (11.5 percentage points), and Kalamansig (11.4 percentage points).

Housing

The Countryside in Figures: Sultan Kudarat Province, 2023 Edition

- In 2015, about 100,450 of the 184,650 households in Sultan Kudarat had houses that were built on lots owned/being amortized. These group of households decreased by 12.36 percent from 2010 figures. About 11.77 percent of the households whose residential lots were owned or being amortized were located in the City of Tacurong; about 10.36 percent in Bagumbayan, about 10.32 percent were in Isulan, and about 9.84 percent in Lebak.
- The total occupied housing units in Sultan Kudarat in 2015 reached 184,650 or an increase of 9.32 percent from the number of units recorded five years ago.
- In 2015, the number of occupied housing units with roofs made of galvanized iron/aluminum constituted 63.28 percent of the households in Sultan Kudarat. This group of housing units increased by 22.21 percent from five years ago.
- Among the Municipalities in sultan Kudarat, Palimbang had the highest percentage of housing units with roofs made of cogon/nipa/anahaw with 22.77, followed by Lebak with 12.62 percent. A total of 203 houses had roof made of makeshift/salvaged/improvised materials.

The Countryside in Figures: Sultan Kudarat Province, 2023 Edition

- Municipality of Columbio remained to have the lowest index crime incidence with 6 cases from Year 2020-2022 while Bagumbayan posted the highest with 36 index crime incidence among the 11 municipalities in the province. Index crimes include actual crimes of murder, homicide, physical injury (serious and less serious), robbery, theft, and rape.
- In 2022, among the 11 municipalities, the lowest non-index crime incidence was noted in Lutayan with 15 cases while Isulan had the highest with 139 cases. Non-index crimes include negligent manslaughter, non-aggravated assault, forgery & counterfeiting, fraud, embezzlement, stolen property, vandalism, weapons, prostitution & common law vice, sex offenses, narcotic laws, gambling, offenses against family & children, driving under the influence of liquor, disorderly conduct, and all other crimes not listed under index crimes.
- In 2022, the policeman to population ratio was lowest in the municipality of Palimbang at 1,975 persons per police while the ratio was highest in Columbio at 671 person per police.

Glossary of Terms

GENERAL INFORMATION

Household – a social unit consisting of a person living alone or a group of persons who sleep in the same housing unit and have a common arrangement in the preparation and consumption of food.

Household Population – the population enumerated in private households during a census.

Household Size – number of usual members in a private household.

Human Development Index – a measure of how well a country has performed, not only in terms of real income growth, but also in terms of social indicators of people's ability to lead a long and healthy life, to acquire knowledge and skills, and to have access to the resources needed to afford a decent standard of living.

Medium Assumption – moderate fertility decline and mortality decline.

Population – total number of individuals in a territory at a specified time. It covers both nationals and aliens, native and foreign-born persons, internees, refugees and any other group physically present within the borders of a country at a specified time. In assembling national demographic statistics for publication, the basic aim has been to obtain data for the physically present (or de facto) population rather than for the legally established resident (or de jure) inhabitants.

Population Census – the total process of collecting, compiling, evaluating, analyzing and publishing demographic, economic and social data pertaining to all persons in the country or in a well-limited territory.

Population Density – refers to the number of persons per unit of land area (usually in square kilometers). This measure is more meaningful if given as population per unit of arable land.

Population Growth Rate – indicates how fast a population increases or decreases as a result of the interplay of births, deaths, and migration during a given period of time. Where the population is closed, meaning no migration, the population growth rate is the same as the rate of natural increase, i.e., the difference between the number of births and the number of deaths during a specified period of time. The three methods for computing the rate of growth based on the assumption with respect to the change are: arithmetic change, geometric change and exponential change.

Population Projection – computation of future changes in population numbers, given certain assumptions about future trends in the rates of fertility, mortality and migration. Demographers often publish high, medium, and low projections of the same population based on different assumptions of how these rates will change in the future.

INCOME AND POVERTY SITUATION

Annual Per Capita Poverty Thresholds – is the minimum income required for a family/individual to meet the basic food and non-food requirements.

Income Gap – the average income shortfall, expressed in proportion to the poverty threshold, of families/individuals with income below the poverty threshold.

Severity of Poverty (SP) - the total of the squared income/expenditure shortfall (expressed in proportion to the poverty threshold) of families/individuals with income/expenditure below the poverty thresholds, divided by the total number of families/ individuals.

Consumer Price Index (CPI) – measure of the average changes in the prices of a fixed basket of goods and services usually purchased by households for their consumption.

Family – a group of persons usually living together and composed of the head and other persons related to the head by blood, marriage or adoption. It includes both the nuclear and extended family.

Family expenditures – refer to the expenses or disbursements mad by the family purely for personal consumption during the calendar year. They exclude all expenses in relation to farm or business operation, investment ventures, purchase of real property and other disbursements which do not involve personal consumption.

Family size – number of members present in the family.

Magnitude of the Poor – the number of families or the population whose annual per capita income falls below the subsistence/poverty threshold.

Per Capita Income – is obtained by dividing the total family income by the number family members.

Poverty Incidence – proportion of families/population whose annual per capita income falls below the annual per capita poverty threshold to the total number of families/population.

Poverty Threshold – annual per capita income required or the amount to be spent to satisfy nutritional requirements (2,000 Kcal) and other basic needs.

Poverty Gap – the total income/expenditure shortfall (expressed in proportion to the poverty threshold) of families/individuals with income/expenditure below the poverty threshold, divided by the total number of families/individuals.

Subsistence Incidence – proportion of families/population whose annual per capita income falls below the annual per capita food/subsistence threshold to the total number of families/population.

Subsistence and Food Threshold – annual per capita income required or the amount to be spent to satisfy nutritional requirements (2,000 Kcal).

Total Family Income – includes primary income and receipts from other sources received by all family members during the calendar year as participants in any economic activity or as recipients of transfers, pensions, grants, etc.

AGRICULTURE

Agricultural Production – the growing field crops, fruits, nuts, seeds, tree nurseries (except those of forest trees), bulb vegetables and flowers, both in the open and under glass; and the production of coffee, tea, cocoa, rubber; and the production of livestock and livestock products, honey rabbits, fur-bearing animals, silkworm, cocoons, etc. Forestry and fishery production carried on as an ancillary activity on an agricultural holding is also considered as agricultural production.

Aquaculture – sector of fisheries that includes the rearing or raising under controlled conditions of aquatic products such as fish, oysters, mussels, sea weeds and other aquatic resources in sea, lakes and rivers. Examples are fishponds, fish pens and fish cages.

Commercial Fishing – sector of fisheries that includes the catching of fish in marine waters with the use of fishing boat of more than three (3) gross tons and beyond the seven (7) kilometers shoreline limit.

Municipal Fishing – sector of fisheries that includes the catching of fish in marine and inland waters with the use of fishing boat of three (3) gross tons or less, or using gear not requiring the use of boats.

HEALTH

Infant Mortality Rate – the annual number of deaths of infants under one year of age per 1,000 live births.

Maternal Death – the death of woman while pregnant or within 42 days of termination of pregnancy, irrespective of the duration and the site of the pregnancy or its management, but not from accidental or incidental causes.

Maternal Mortality Rate – the annual number of deaths of women from pregnancy-related causes per 100,000 live births.

Morbidity – any departure, subjective or objective, from a stage of physiological well-being.

Mortality Rate – generally expresses the chance that death will occur during a particular period to a person in particular population group alive at the beginning of the period. As such, those rates are true probabilities and describe precisely the risk of dying for any actual cohort.

Contraceptive Prevalence Rate (CPR) - the proportion of currently married women in the reproductive ages of 15-49 years reporting current use of any contraceptive method.

EDUCATION

Cohort Survival Rate – the percentage of enrollees at the beginning grade or year in a given school year who reached the final grade or year of the elementary/secondary level.

Completion Rate – the percentage of first grade/year entrants in a level of education who complete/finish the level in accordance with the required number of years of study.

Dropout Rate – the percentage of pupils/students who leave school during the year for any reason as well as those who complete the previous grade/year level but fail to enroll in the next grade/year level the following school year to the total number of pupils/students enrolled during the previous school year.

Enrollment – the total number of students who have registered as of August 31 in a given school year.

Net Enrolment Ratio – the ratio of the enrolment for the age group corresponding to the official school age in the elementary/secondary level to the population of the same age group in a given year. Also known as Participation Rate.

Transition Rate – the percentage of enrollees/graduates in a level of education in a given school year who moved on to the next higher level the following year.

Repetition rate - this is an EFA indicator which determines the magnitude of pupils/students who repeat a grade/year level.

Primary School – the first part of the educational system, and it includes the first six years of compulsory education from grade 1 to 6, with an optional 7th grade offered by some schools

Secondary School – also known as high school, and it consist of two levels: Lower secondary education (Junior High school): Grade 7 to 10. Upper Secondary Education (Senior High school): Grade 11 to 12.

Multigrade Class – is one that contains two or more grade levels of students.

Monograde Class – are normally the preferred unit of organization in graded school system.

PUBLIC ORDER AND SAFETY

Crime Incidence – the number of crimes reported as to index or non-index crimes within a given period.

Crime Rate – number of crimes committed per 10,000 population.

Index Crimes – crimes which are sufficiently significant and which occur with sufficient regularity to be meaningful. Crimes which include the following: murder, physical injury, robbery, theft and rape.

Non – Index Crimes – all types of crimes not considered as index crimes.

Crime Volume – the number of crime incidents committed in a given area.

Crime Clearance Efficiency – is a percentage of cleared cases out of the total number of crime incidents.

Crime Solution Efficiency - is the percentage of solved cases out of the total number of crime incidents handled by law enforcement agencies.

Fire Incident - is defined as an incident involving smoke, heat, and. flames causing property damage to multiple building fixtures or fittings.

PUBLIC FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

Annual Income – refers to revenues and receipts realized by provinces, cities and municipalities from the regular sources of Local General fund inclusive of IRA and other shares provided for in Section 284, section 290 and Section 291 of the Local Government Code of 1991 or RA No. 7160, exclusive, however, of non-recurring receipts such as national aids, grants, financial assistance, loan proceeds, sales of assets, and other. As provided for under Section 1 and Section 2 of Executive Order No. 249, dated July 25, 1987, provinces, cities and municipalities, except Manila and Quezon City which shall remain special class cities, shall be divided into six (6) main classes according to the average annual income realized during the last four calendar years immediately preceding the year of re-classification. Based on the Financial Statement of the LGUs for CY 2004-2007 of the Commission on Audit, the income brackets of provinces, cities and municipalities which shall be used in their re-classification are ranged, as follows:

Grants – all non-repayable transfers received from other levels of government or from private individuals, or institutions including reparations and gifts given for particular projects or programs, or for general budget support.

Non-Tax Revenue – revenue collected from sources other than compulsory tax levies. Includes those collected in exchange for direct services rendered by government agencies to the public, or those arising from the government's regulatory and investment activities.

Personal Services – provisions for the payment of salaries, wages and other compensation (e.g., merit, salary increase, cost of living allowances, honoraria and commutable allowances) of permanent, temporary, contractual and casual employees of the government.

Revenue – a cash inflow which does not increase the liability of the government.

Taxes on Income and Profit – taxes imposed on all taxable income earned or received by a taxpayer whether an individual, partnership, or corporation, during a particular period of time, usually lasting one year.

Taxes on Property – taxes imposed on the ownership of wealth or immovable properties and on the transfer of real or personal properties, both tangible and intangible.

Tax Revenue - is defined as the revenues collected from taxes on income and profits, social security contributions, taxes levied on goods and services, payroll taxes, taxes on the ownership and transfer of property, and other taxes.

Expenditure – the action of spending funds.

Net Operating Income (NOI) - is a formula those in real estate use to quickly calculate profitability of a particular investment. NOI determines the revenue and profitability of invested real estate property after subtracting necessary operating expenses.
