

YEAR-ON-YEAR INFLATION RATES

The headline inflation or the annual rate of change on the prices of goods and services in the market basket in General Santos for the month of October 2022 slowed down to 7.0 percent from last month's inflation at 7.7 percent. The City's inflation rate is higher by 0.5 percentage points than the regional level at 6.5 percent, however, lower by 0.7 percentage points in the national level at 7.7 percent. With this month's inflation, its average inflation for All items from January to October 2022 stood at 6.4 percent. (Table D and Figure 1).

The main source in the downward trend of the City's inflation was the slower annual growth rate in the indices of housing, electricity, gas, and other fuels with 2.1 percent inflation from 6.6 percent in September 2022 and transport with 15.7 percent from 20.2 percent in September 2022.

Under the housing, electricity, gas, and other fuels group, electricity had the biggest contribution in the slower inflation with 92.4 percent share from 17.0 percent inflation in September 2022 to negative 0.6 percent in October 2022. Liquefied hydrocarbons had 7.0 percent with a decline inflation of negative 1.5 percent from 6.3 percent from a month ago. Charcoal had minimal contribution with 6.0 percent inflation from 6.8 percent, as well as liquid fuels with 52.7 percent from 68.7 percent.

Under the transport group, gasoline recorded to have a slower price adjustments with 75.4 percent contribution to the downtrend and with 13.2 percent inflation from 26.3 percent in September 2022. Slower annual growth was also observed in Diesel with 23.7 percent contribution and recorded an inflation of 57.5 percent in October 2022 from 74.4 percent of last month's inflation. Also, passenger transport by sea and inland water way contributed to the downtrend in the inflation with 0.7 percent contribution and recorded a decline of inflation at negative 44.0 percent in October 2022 from 20.2 percent in September 2022. Bicycles also contributed with 0.2 percent share in the downtrend at 5.8 percent inflation from 6.2 percent of last month.

Meanwhile, the following commodity groups continuously displayed increases in the annual indices for the month of October 2022;

- a) Food and non-alcoholic beverages, 10.1% from 9.4%;
- b) Alcoholic beverages and tobacco, 9.9% from 9.6%;
- c) Clothing and Footwear, 4.0%, from 3.8%;
- d) Furnishings, household equipment and routine household maintenance, 3.2%, from 3.1%;
- e) Recreation, Sport and Culture, 4.5% from 2.9%;
- f) Restaurants and Accommodation Services, 3.3% from 1.7%;
- g) Personal Care, and Miscellaneous Goods and Services, 3.3% from 2.6%.

The rest of the commodity groups maintained their previous month's inflation rates (Table B).

Food inflation continued to rise in October 2022. Fish and other seafoods contributed 63.4% to the uptrend with 9.6% inflation; sugar, confectionery and desserts had 13.0 percent contribution and with 34.8 percent inflation; milk, other dairy products and eggs with 11.3 percent contribution and with 6.9 percent inflation; vegetables, tubers, plantains, cooking bananas and pulses shared 4.7 percent and with 15.3 percent inflation. Also, flour, bread and other bakery products, pasta products and other cereals contributed 3.8 percent with 13.8 percent inflation and ready-made food and other seafood products n.e.c. with 3.1 percent share and with 7.2 inflation (Table C).
