# Cotabato Province Headline Inflation went up at 8.0% in January 2023



### YEAR-ON-YEAR INFLATION RATES

Headline inflation rate or the annual rate of change on the prices of goods and services in the market basket in Cotabato Province went up to 8.0 percent in January 2023 from 7.4 percent in December 2022. This is higher than the regional but lower than the national level at 7.4 percent and 8.7 percent respectively. A uptrend inflation rate was observed for this month. Inflation in January 2022 was lower at 4.1 percent. The inflation for All items in January 2023 stood at 8.0 percent. (Table 1 and Figure 1).

The acceleration inflation rate in Cotabato Province for the month of January 2023 was mainly brought about by the higher annual increased growths in the index of Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages at 10.5 percent from 9.1 percent in the previous month; Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels at 6.4 percent from 5.6 percent in the previous month; Health at 3.2 percent from 2.7 percent; Personal Care, and Miscellaneous goods and services at 7.3 percent from 7.0 percent; Clothing and Footwear at 6.1 percent from 5.8 percent and Furnishing, Household equipment and routine household maintenance at 5.3 percent from 5.1 percent.

On the contrary, the commodity that shows downtrend are the following:

- A. Transport, **8.7 percent from 10.5 percent**;
- B. Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco, 10.8 percent from 11.2 percent;
- C Recreation, Sport and Culture, 5.1 percent from 5.3 percent.
- D. Restaurant and Accommodation services, 0.5 percent from 0.7 percent.
- E. Information and Communication, 1.6 percent from 1.7 percent.

Meanwhile, the commodity groups maintained their previous month's inflation rates or had zero percent annual growth are the following: (See Table 2).

- A. Education services, **2.2 percent**;
- B. Financial services, 0.0 percent.

The major contributors to inflation were Cereals and cereal product (ND) at (6.7 percent from 6.3 percent); Vegetables, tubers, plantains, cooking bananas and pulses (ND) at (22.0 percent from 14.5 percent); Fish and other seafoods (ND) at (4.1 percent from 2.1 percent); Milk, other dairy products and egg (ND) at (5.0 percent from 3.9 percent); Ready-made food and other food products n.e.c (ND) at (9.1 percent from 9.0 percent); Fruits and nuts (ND) at (4.1 percent from -0.1 percent)

On the contrary, the food indices that deflated were **Meat and other parts of slaughtered land** animals (ND) at (15.8 percent from 17.1 percent); Sugar, confectionary and desserts (ND) at (55.5 percent from 58.8 percent); and Oils and fats (ND) at (25.7 percent from 27.7 percent).

## The following food groups exhibited an inflation during the month:

a Cereals and cereal products (ND), 6.7 percent;

n.e.c (ND)

- b Vegetables, tubers, plantains, cooking bananas and pulses (ND), 22.0 percent;
- c Fish and other sea foods (ND) at **4.1 percent**.

### **Technical Notes**

Headline Inflation Rate	refers to the rate of change in the CPI, a measure of the average price of a
	standard basket of goods and services consumed by a typical family.

Base Period/Year	this refers to the period, usually a year, at which the index number/points is
	set to 100. It is the point of the index number series.

Consumer Price Index	the average retail prices of a fixed basket of goods and services commonly
	purchased by households relative to a base year.

Inflation Rate	the annual rate of change or the year-on-year change in the CPI expressed
	in percent

Market basket	refers to a sample of goods and services that are commonly purchased and
	bought by an average Filipino household.

**Weights** a system that considers the relevance of the components of the index.

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
