
YEAR-ON-YEAR INFLATION RATES

The headline inflation or the annual rate of change on the prices of goods and services in the market basket of South Cotabato increased to 7.3 percent in January 2023 from 7.1 percent in December 2022. A difference of 0.2 percentage point from the previous month. From January 2022 to January 2023, the highest monthly inflation rate was recorded this month at 7.3 percent and the lowest was in March 2022 at 2.9 percent (Table 1 and Figure 1).

The increase in the province's inflation rate in January 2023 was primarily due to the higher annual growths in Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages at 8.0 percent, Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance at 8.7 percent, and Health at 4.0 percent. The following commodity groups also contributed to the upward trend of the headline inflation during the month:

- a. Recreation, Sport and Culture, 5.8
- b. Personal Care, and Miscellaneous Goods and Services, 4.9
- c. Information and Communication, 1.0
- d. Clothing and Footwear, 3.4

On the contrary, lower annual increases were observed in Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco at 10.8 percent, Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels at 7.6 percent, Transport at 8.0 percent, and Restaurants and Accommodation Services at 8.8 percent. Education Services and Financial Services retained their previous month's inflation rates and had zero percent annual growths (Table 2).

Meanwhile, inflation for food increased to 8.1 percent in January 2023, from 7.4 percent in December 2022. In January 2022, food inflation was lower at 5.2 percent (*Table 3*).

The top three food groups that contributed to the increase in food inflation were Fruits and Nuts at 19.8 percent, Fish and other seafood at 3.9 percent, and Meat and other parts of slaughtered land animals at 11.3 percent.
