Highlights of the Population of Makilala, Cotabato 2020 Census of Population and Housing (2020 CPH)

Date of Release: September 17, 2021 Reference No. 47R12-Cotabato-2021-16

As of May 1, 2020, the population of Makilala is 87,927 which is based on the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (2020 CPH). The official count is declared by the President of the Philippines under Proclamation No. 1179 dated July 6, 2021.

The 2020 population is higher by 4,076 persons as compared to the population in 2015 which is 83,851 and also higher by 10,418 persons compared to the 2010 with 77,508. (Table 1)

Among the 17 municipalities and one city in the province, the Municipality of Makilala ranked 7th with highest population of 87,927 persons, comprises of 5.89 percent of the total population of the

From 2015 to 2020, the population of Makilala decreased by 1.00 percent annually, lower by 0.51 percent as compared from 2010 to 2015 with 1.51 annual population growth rate. (Table 2)

Among the 38 barangays in the municipality, the highest in terms of population size is Poblacion with 11,072 persons. It was followed by barangay Saguing with 7,827 persons, Malasila ranked third with 6,845 persons, San Vicente with 6,131 persons and Kisante with 5,184 persons. The combined population of these five barangays accounted for about 42.14 percent of the total population of Makilala in 2020. (Table 4)

Barangay Leboce was the least populous barangay in the Municipality of Makilala with 388 persons. It was followed by Villaflores with 579 persons, Guangan with 726 persons, Dagupan with 743 persons and Malungon with 789 persons. (Table 5)

The total land area of Makilala is 343.57 square kilometers and the population density of Makilala in 2020 was recorded at 256 persons per square kilometer. This represents an increase of 12 persons per square kilometer from the population density of 244 persons per square kilometer in 2015. In 2010, there were about 226 persons residing in every square kilometer of land in the municipality. (Table 6)

The population figures in this report were based on the results of the 2020 CPH. The land area were based on the 2013 Masterlist of Land Areas of Cities and Municipalities provided to the Philippine Statistics Authority (PSA) by the Land Management Bureau (LMB).

TECHNICAL NOTES

- The 2020 CPH was undertaken by the Philippine Statistics Authority in September 2020 pursuant to Republic Act No. 10625, also known as the Philippine Statistical Act of 2013 and Batas Pambansa Bilang 72 further accorded the PSA the authority to conduct population censuses every ten (10) years beginning in 1980.
- Information on the count of population were collected with 12:01 a.m. of May 1, 2020 as the census reference time and date.
- The 2020 CPH is the country's 15th Census of Population and 7th Census of Housing since 1903.
- Doubling time is the amount of time it takes for a given quantity to double in size or value at a
 constant growth rate. We can find the doubling time for a population undergoing exponential
 growth by using the Rule of 70. To compute for doubling time, we divide 70 by the growth rate
 (r).
- His Excellency President Rodrigo R. Duterte declared as official fo all purposes the population counts by province, city/municipality and barangay, based on the 2020 CPH under Proclamation No. 1179 dated 06 July 2021. The population counts were based on census questionnaires accomplished by about 90,000 enumerators deployed during the nationwide census undertaking.
- The successful completion of the census-taking was made possible with the support of the local and national officials, government agencies, local government units, private and non-government organizations.
