Highlights of the Population of Municipality of M'lang, Cotabato based on the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (2020 CPH)


M'lang, Cotabato recorded a total population of 98,195 persons

The Municipality of M'lang in the Province of Cotabato has a total population of 98,195 as of May 1, 2020 based on the result of the 2020 Census of Population and Housing (2020 CPH).

The 2020 population of the municipality of M'lang is higher by 3,125 compared with the population of 95,070 in 2015; 10,446 versus the population in 2010 with 87,749 and more than doubled or 56,110 higher compared six decades ago with the population of 42,085 in 1960.

The population of the Municipality of M'lang grew by 0.68 percent

M'lang, Cotabato increased its population by 0.68 percent annually, on average, during theperiod 2015-2020. By comparison, the annual population growth rate of M'lang during the period 2015-2020 decreased by (-55.84) percent compared to 2010-2015 with 1.54% population growth rate (pgr).

If the municipality's current annual population growth rate (APGR) of 0.68 percent continues, the population of M'lang is expected to double in 102.94 years.

M'lang ranked 5th as the most populous municipality in Cotabato.

The municipality of M'lang ranked 5th as the most populous municipality in Cotabato or 6.59 percent of the total population of Cotabato with a total of 1,490,618 persons.

Dungo-an ranked 1 as the most populous barangay in Municipality of M'lang in

Cotabato

The Barangay of Dungo-an recorded the highest population with 7,658 persons or 7.80 percent of the total population of the municipality. This was followed by barangays of Bagontapay with 7,121 and Poblacion with 4,913 persons or 7.25 and 5.0 percent, respectively.

Meanwhile, the Barangay of La Suerte registered the lowest population with 705 individuals or 0.72 percent of the total population of M'lang.




Figure 3. Total Population in M'lang, Cotabato per Barangay as of May 1, 2020

The barangays of Liboo and Calunasan were the top two fastest growing

barangay with an average PGR of 5.16 percent and 4.07 percent, respectively. On the other hand, Barangay Malayan was the slowest with an APGR of -8.04 percent.

TECHNICAL NOTES

- The 2020 CPH was undertaken by the Philippine Statistics Authority in September 2020 pursuant to Republic Act No. 10625, also known as the Philippine Statistical Act of 2013 and Batas Pambansa Bilang 72 further accorded the PSA the authority to conduct population censuses every ten (10) years beginning in 1980.
- Information on the count of population were collected with 12:01 a.m. of May 1, 2020 as the census reference time and date.
- The 2020 CPH is the country's 15th Census of Population and 7th Census of Housing since 1903.
- Doubling time is the amount of time it takes for a given quantity to double in size or value at a constant growth rate. We can find the doubling time for a population undergoing exponential growth by using the Rule of 70. To compute for doubling time, we divide 70 by the growth rate (r).
- His Excellency President Rodrigo R. Duterte declared as official for all purposes the population counts by province, city/municipality and barangay, based on the 2020 CPH under Proclamation No. 1179 dated 06 July 2021. The population counts were based on census questionnaires accomplished by about 90,000 enumerators deployed during the nationwide census undertaking.
- The successful completion of the census-taking was made possible with the support
 of the local and national officials, government agencies, local government units,
 private and non-government organizations.
